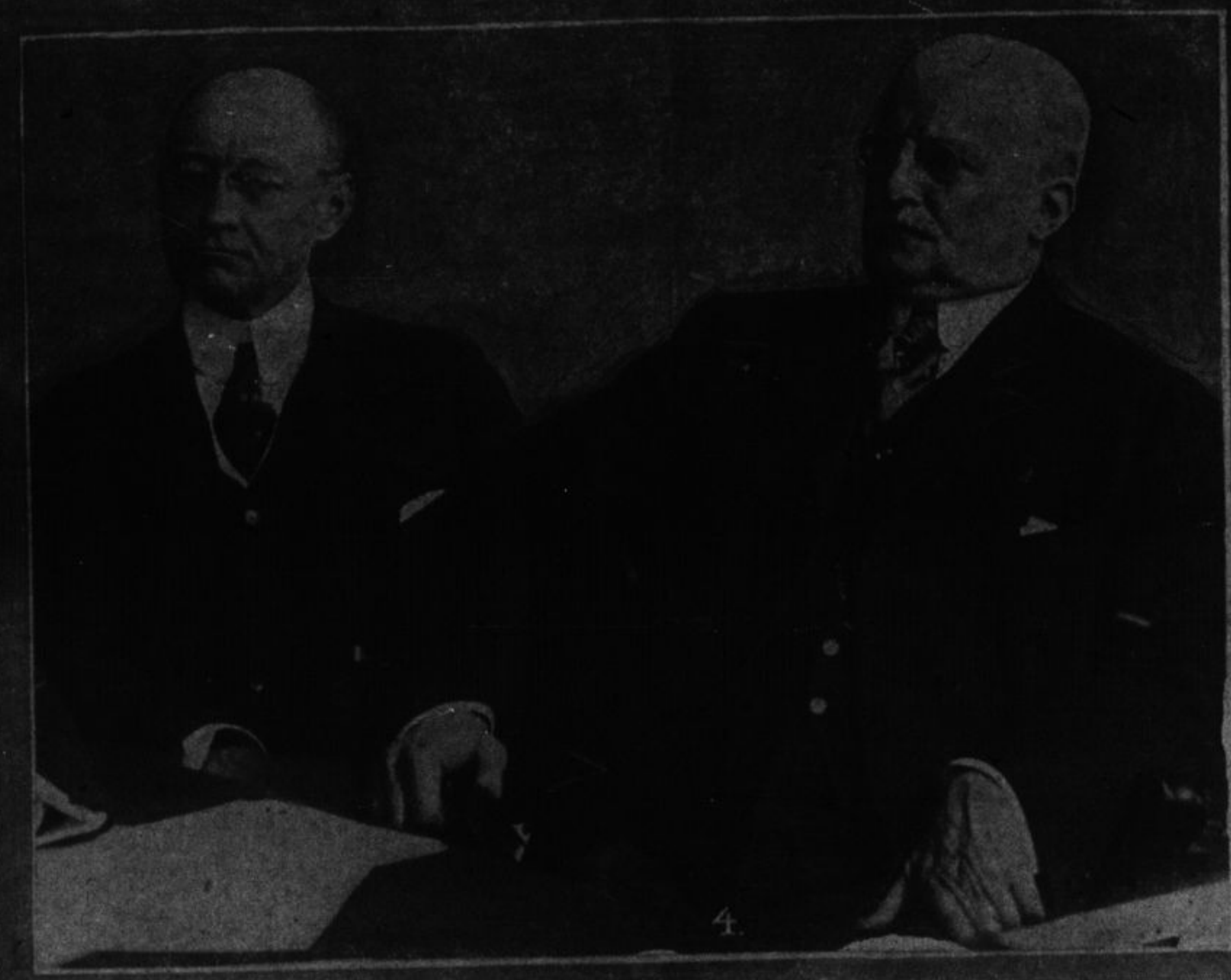
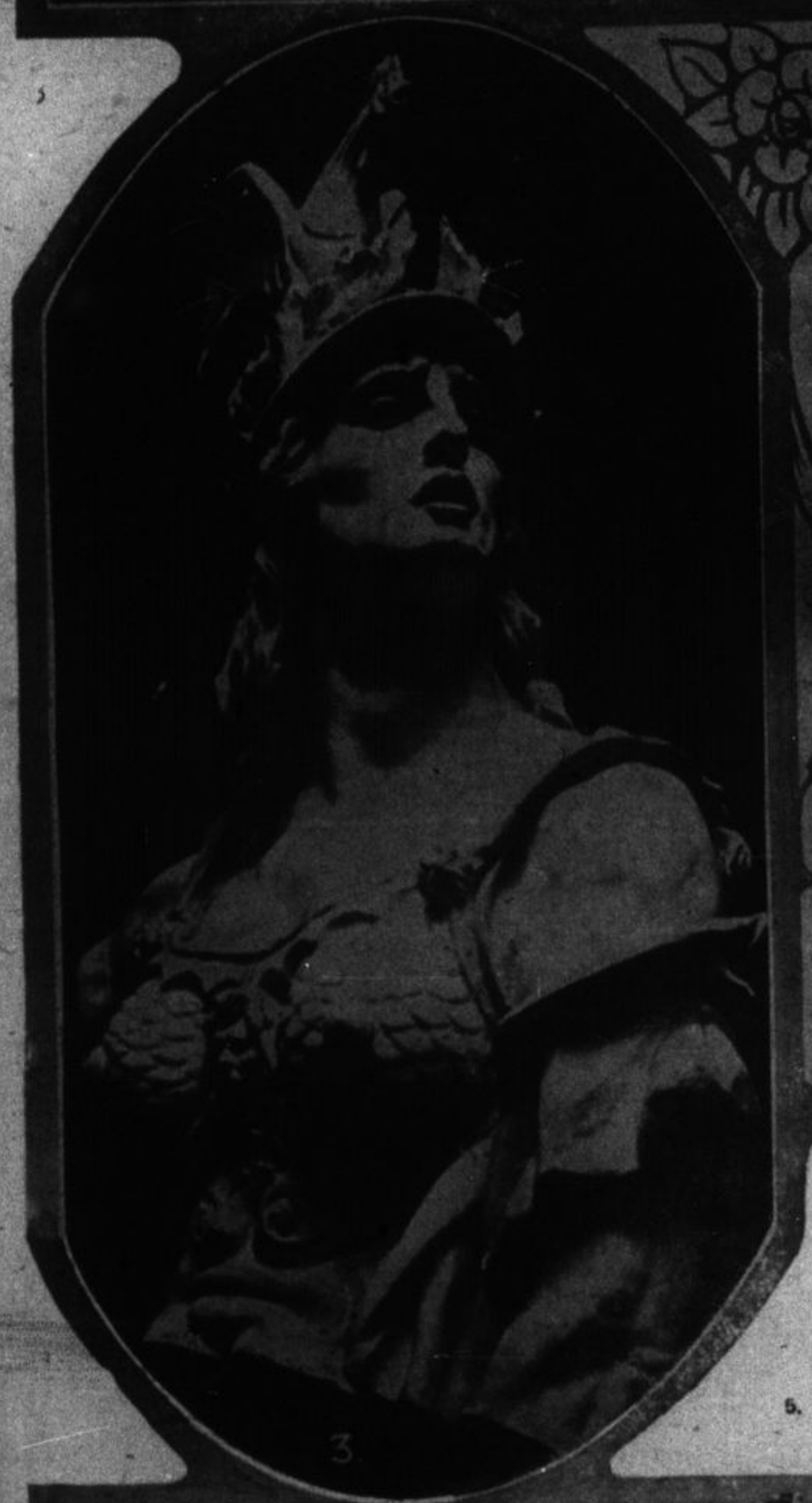


## "Fragments From France" -- Paris Again Flooded -- Investigating the "Leak"
