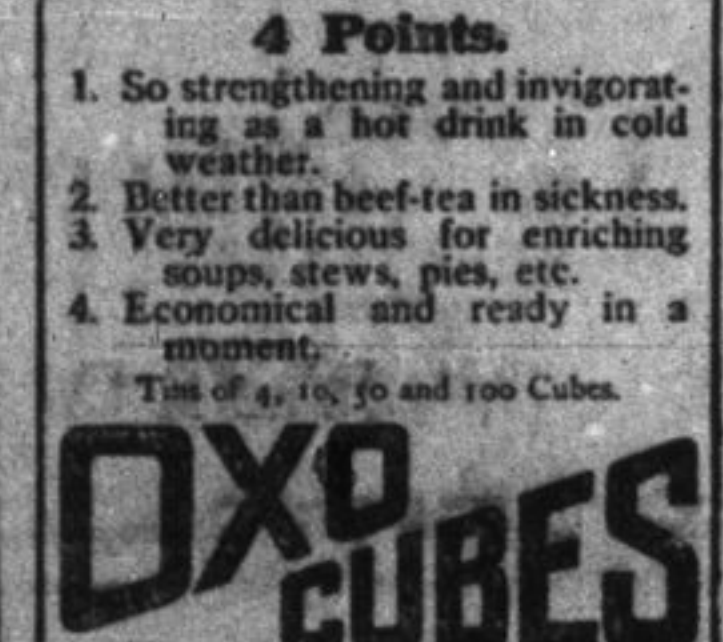
ECHO LAKE. Feb. 9.—Mrs. Daniel McCleod passed away at her home on Monday evening after a long illness.
