England's Importance.

At the moment Germany suggests peace we see the control of the policy and purposes of her three great opponents passing into hands determined to carry on the war, and with all three of her great foes reorganizing their ministries and replacing their generals with the plain pur-pose to push the campaign and with not the smallest suggestion that peace is expected or desired on any but terms that only a victor can dictate. To men these crises in Britain, France, and Russia are the strongest reasons why the German proposals will fail to end the war, rather, I think they will accelerate the pace of the fighting, when spring comes, and it is possible to move in France and Belgium again. And henceforth the part that Britain will play in the coalition against Germany will increase steadily. In my judgment, it may become commanding, if, as many Englishmen believe, Great Britain has found in Lloyd George another Pitt.-From "Peace, Politics, and War-a Marvelous Mouth," by Frank H.
