Greater Production Circular

J. W. Bradshaw, county clerk, is sending circular letters to the reeves of the county asking for township councils to take up the Greater Production Movement and have every public spirited country resident to aid in every way. A paragraph of the letter reads as follows:

"Your Township Council to meet and consider, (1) Greater Production of Food stuffs; (2) actual needs of your district in respect of labor; (3) registration somewhere (preferably at Government office at Kingston) and record of scale of wages payable to men and boys: (4) to get in touch with school teachers, and find how many boys are available for service; (5) to ask clergymen to interest people in matter of such vital importance, for increased production of all farm and garden products in view of world shortage of food
