LIEUT.-COL. VERNON EATON
FORMER R.C.H.A. OFFICER IS DEAD OF WOUNDS

Commanded 8th Brigade, 3rd Canadian Division—Evidently Wounded in the Last Drive.

"Lieut.-Col. Daniel Isaac Vernon Eaton died of wounds," was a cable received by the Whig from London on Saturday morning, and the message brought the deepest regret from hundreds of Kingston friends of this popular officer. Col. Eaton was with the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery here for several years and left with that unit for overseas with Canada's first contingent. He took with him a long military experience and was even then considered one of the best of officers.

Col. Eaton left the R.C.H.A., at the same time as Lieut.-Col. J. N. S. Leslie about a year ago. Both received promotions, Col. Eaton then receiving his brevet lieutenant-colonelcy and being appointed to command the 8th Brigade, Field Artillery, Third Division.

The dead officer was born on September 19th, 1859, and since 1887 when he was appointed as a lieutenant in the 93rd Battalion, he steadily rose, becoming one of the most efficient in the permanent force of Canada. When the South African war broke out he went there with the R.C.H.A., and was in battles in the Transvaal and east of Pretoria, Belfast, Orange River, Lydenburg, west of Pretoria and in Cape Colony south of the Orange River. For his work there he was decorated with the Queen's medal and three clasps. At Malakka, he was on special service with Major Gen. Baden-Powell. The late Col. Eaton was a graduate of the English Staff College.

The home of the late Col. Eaton was in Nova Scotia. His widow and two daughters are in England.

KINGSTONIAN IN TROUBLE
Watertown Police Asked to Hold Frederick Caine.
A despatch from Watertown says: The local police have been asked to hold Fred Caine, a Canadian, who is believed to be in this city. He was held in Rochester some time ago for the Canadian authorities on the charge of non-support of his wife, who lived at Kingston, Ont. It is said that the warrant expired, but that Caine was deported from Rochester.
