Baroness Operated Wirelessly. Seattle, Wash., April 16.—Wireless apparatus set up in their residence by Baron Frederick von Lichtenow and his wife has been seized. The baroness recently admitted that before coming to Seattle from Germany she passed number one in a competitive examination for telegrapher in one of the German military offices.

Export of Rubles Prohibited. Ottawa, April 16.—The exportation of natural and synthetic sapphires and rubies to destinations abroad, other than points in Great Britain, has been forbidden by order-in-Council.

Tea Per Cent. Wage Increase. Steelton, Pa., April 16.—General Manager Quincy Bent of the Bethlehem Steel Co., announced today that effective May 1st, an increase approximating ten per cent. will be given.

U.S. Loan To Allies. Washington, April 16.—The seven-billion-dollar bond issue passed the House unanimously Saturday afternoon. It provides for an immediate loan of three billion to the Allies of the United States.

HORSE DROPPED AND DIED

It Was Actually Frightened to Death—Three Boys Arrested for Theft—A Factory Girl Gets Suspended Sentence.
