April 25.—Mrs. Williamson and her sister, Miss Babcock, are spending two weeks visiting friends in Port Hope and Peterborough.

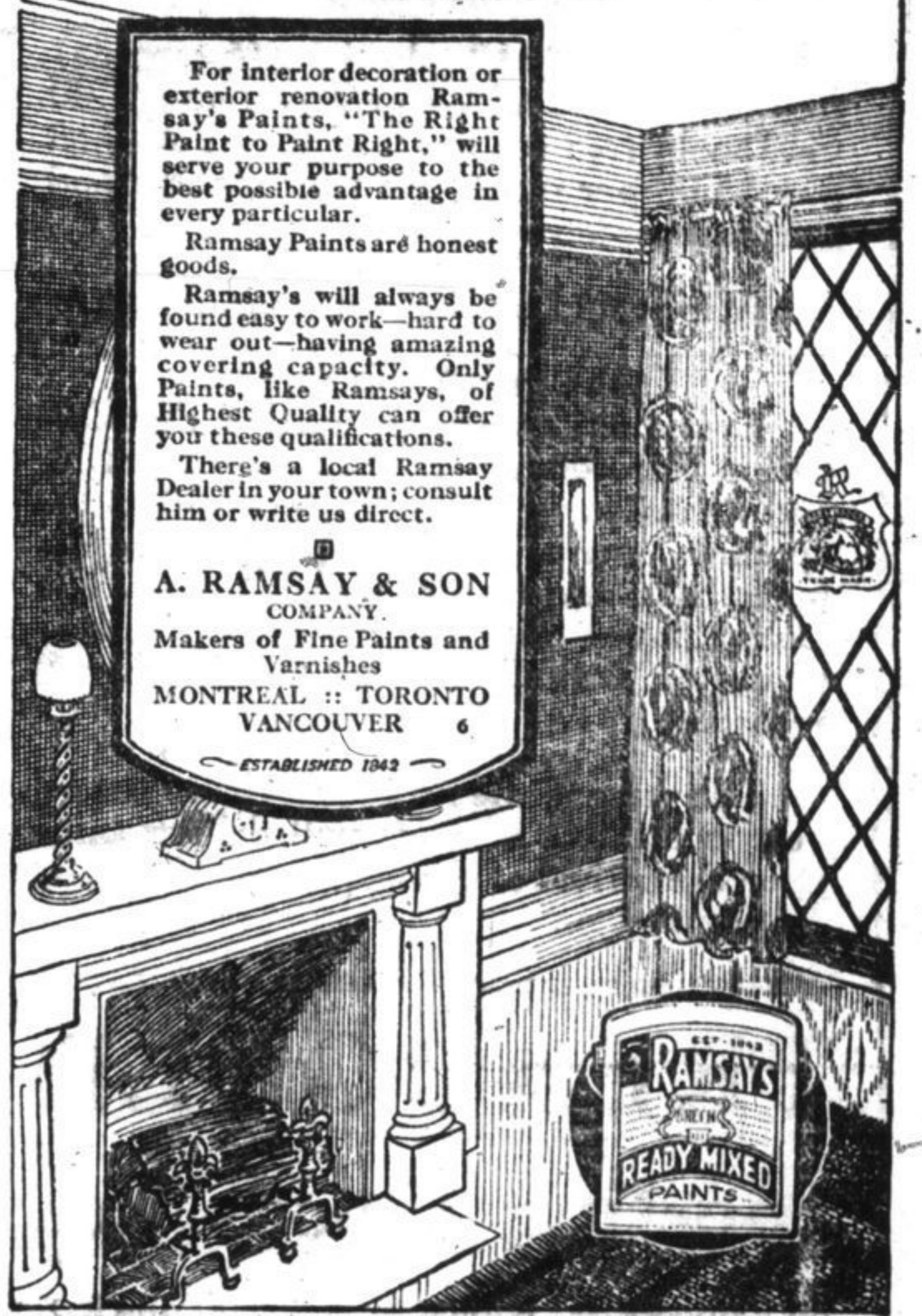
