Home For Aged People. Kingston, May 19.—(To the Editor): The commission which is now managing the Home for Aged People, under the direction of the City Council, have been pressed with the necessity for enlarging its dormitory and dining-room accommodation.

Since then the number of attendants has been very much increased—thirteen aged people from the counties have been admitted since the beginning of this year—and at the present time the institution is occupied to its fullest capacity.

There are two ways open to the commissioners. They can appeal to those who are possessed of the means for a loan conditionally. There may be in the city one who will imitate a certain benefactor of the University with regard to the erection of one of its buildings.
