FURIOUS ATTACKS MADE BY AUSTRIANS

They Were Futile and Cost Them Five Thousand in Casualties.

(Special to the Whig.) Rome, June 7 .- Farious but futile counter-attacks by the Austrians have cost them 5,000 in casualties in the past few days, according to semi-official estimates to-day. At no place have they succeeded in denting the line, which the Italian offensive has pushed toward Trieste. Officials estimate that at least 100,000 Austrians participated in the counter offensive of the past three days.

AUSTRIANS CLAIM CAPTURE

Of 60,250 Prisoners in Counter-Offensives Against Italians.

(Special to the Whig.) Vienna, June 7 .- Ten thousand wo hundred and fifty prisoners including entire regiments have been captured by the Austrian counteroffensive in three days fighting over a battle field near Jamiano, strewn with Italian corpses, today's official

statement declared. "Between the Wippoch Valley and the sea the enemy's assaults were shattered," the War Office reported. storming a height near Jamiano, re taining all ground won."
