## OBITUARY

### The Late A. Frost.

On Wednesday afternoon after a few days' illness, death came to Arthur Frost at the home of his grandfather, J. J. Otto, 34 Frontenac street. The deceased was born in the city twenty-nine years ago, the son of the late Arthur Frost, who for many years conducted the Savings painting business, and Mrs. Frost, of the city. His father predeceased the son seventeen years. Up to a month ago the young man was an instructor in the Ontario Agricultural College, where he was highly regarded. He contracted pneumonia on his return to the city, and died as a result. He was a Baptist in religion. His mother, his grandparents and his uncle, C. H. Otto, survive.

## FURIOUS ATTACKS MADE BY AUSTRILIANS They Were Futile and Cost Them Five Thousand in Casualties.

(Special to this Whig.) Rome, June 7.—Furious but futile counter-attacks by the Austrians have cost them 5,000 in casualties in the past few days, according to semi-official estimates today. At no place have they succeeded in denting the line which the Italian offensive has pushed toward Trieste. Official estimates that at least 100,000 Austrians participated in the counter-offensive of the past three days.

## AUSTRILIANS CLAIM CAPTURE OF 20,000 Prisoners in Counter-Offensive Against Italians.

(Special to this Whig.) Vienna, June 7.—Ten thousand two hundred and fifty prisoners including entire regiments have been captured by the Austrian counter-offensive in three days fighting over a battle field near Jamiano, a stream with Italian corpses, today's official statement declared. "Between the Wiploch Valley and the sea the enemy's assaults were shattered," the War Office reported. "We enlarged our successes by storming a height near Jamiano, retaining all ground won."

## In Complete Accord.

(Special to this Whig.) London, June 7.—"The British Government, the House of Commons and the country is in complete accord with the war aims as announced by the French Chambers of Parliament," declared Sir George Cave, Secretary of State for Home Affairs in the House of Commons today.
