life. But such a condition did not exist.

FOOD "SHARKS" TAKE \$50,000,000 MONTHLY

Flour Should Not Have Gone Above Nine Dollars a Barrel.
Washington, June 21.—Food speculators have been taking \$50,000,000 a month for the last five months—a total of a quarter of a billion dollars—from the American people, Herbert C. Hoover told the Senators in explaining the purposes of the food control bill now before Congress.
Disclaiming entirely that the bill sets up a food dictatorship, Mr. Hoover told the Senators its purposes were entirely to organize the resources of the country and the extraction to limit middlemen's commissions and prevent extortion.
"With righteous manufacturers and distributors' prices," he said, "the price of flour should not have been over \$9 a barrel. Yet it averaged \$14. In the last 60 months \$250,000,000 has been extracted from the American consumer in excess of normal profits of manufacturers and distributors."
