Light For Fort Henry.

Lieut.-Col. Benoit, 3rd divisional engineer, asked the Commission to supply electricity to Fort Henry. The Militia Department desired to rect a number of lights around the place. The Department would erect the poles, wires and lamps. The Commission will supply the current necessary in the meantime, but will endeavor to secure a contract from the Militia Department for permanently lighting the Royal Military College, Fort Henry and Barriefield camp. At present it has a temporary line over the old wooden bridge which connects the city with the Pittsburg shore. A permanent line will be required over the new causeway, which will cost \$3,000 to erect. If a permanent contract can be secured from the Department, the Commission would at once construct this new line. Col. Benoit and Manager Folger will take up the matter with the Department at Ottawa.
