PRINCIPAL GORDON'S TRIBUTE TO LATE PROF. N. F. DUPUIS

At the Funeral Service Held on Friday Afternoon in Chalmers Church—Deceased Was Particularly Eminent as a Teacher.

"It is recorded in Scripture that David of Israel, after serving his own generation by the will of God, fell asleep. So of the eminent teacher, whose loss we mourn, and to whom we pay our last tribute of respect today, we may truly say, 'He served well his own generation, and has fallen asleep.'"

Meeting Will be Held at Thousand Island House.

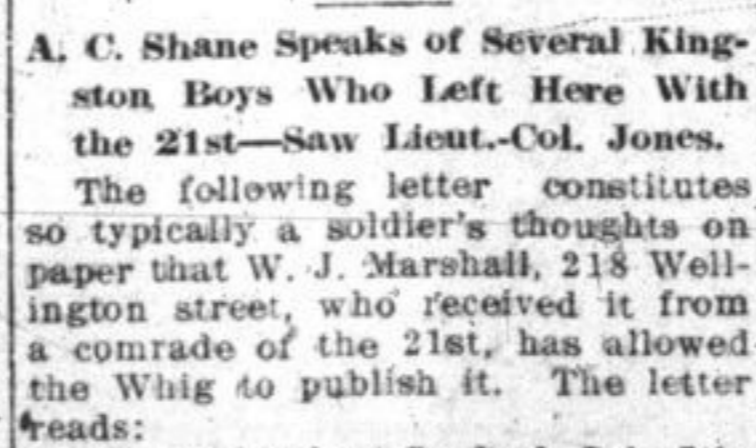

The partnership between E. Guss Porter and William Carrow, Belleville, barbers and solicitors, has been dissolved.

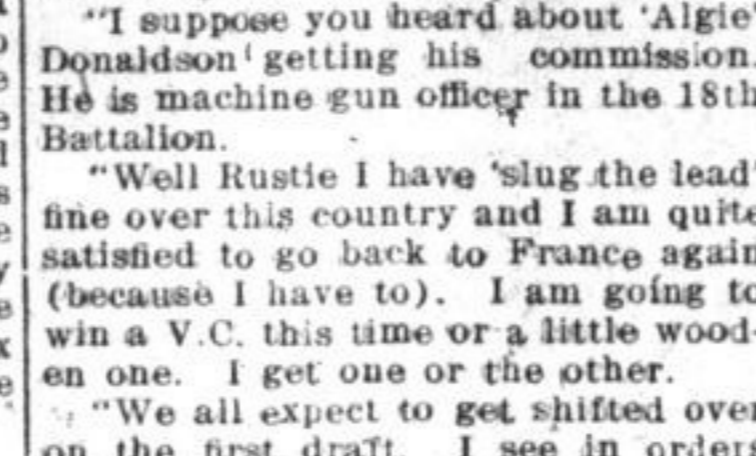
