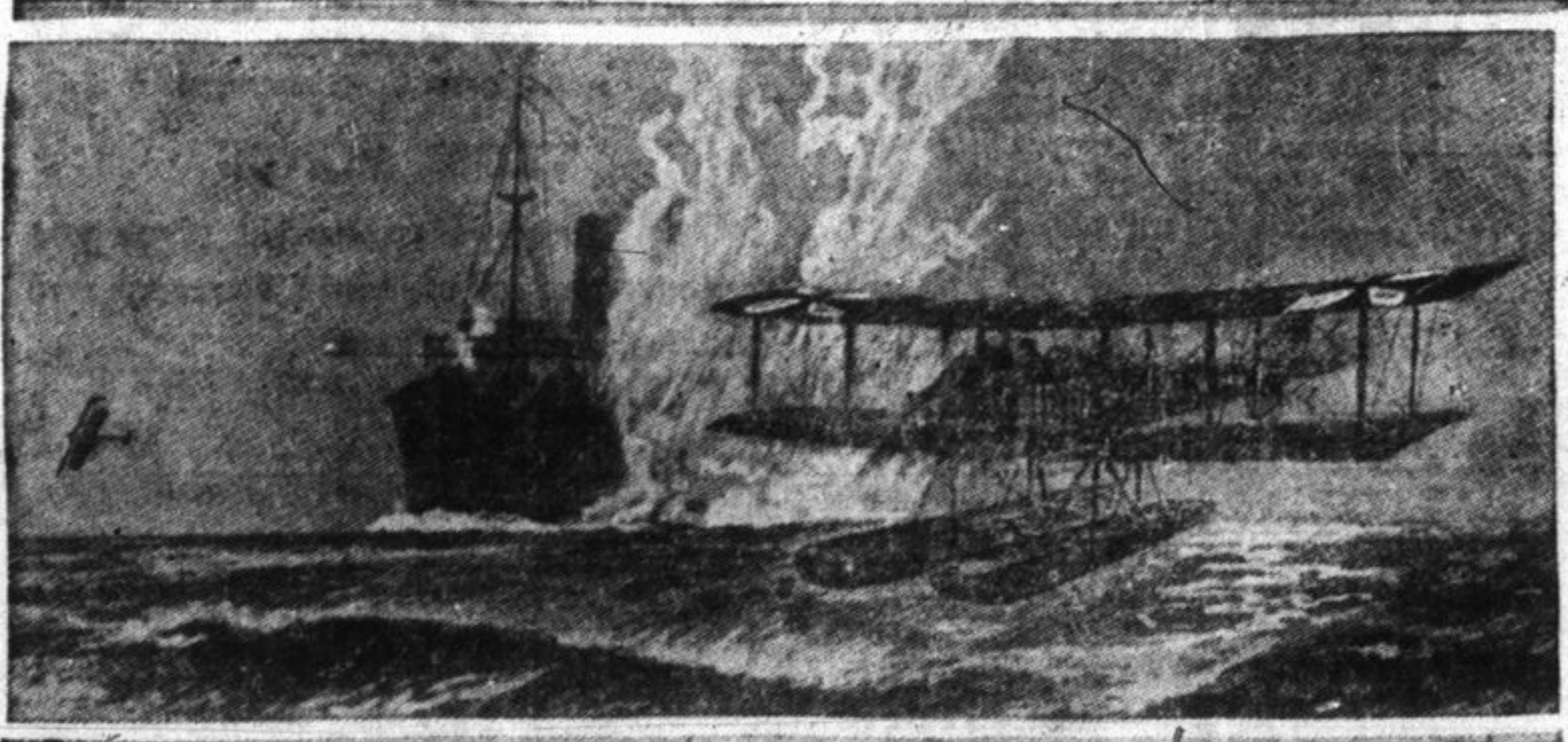
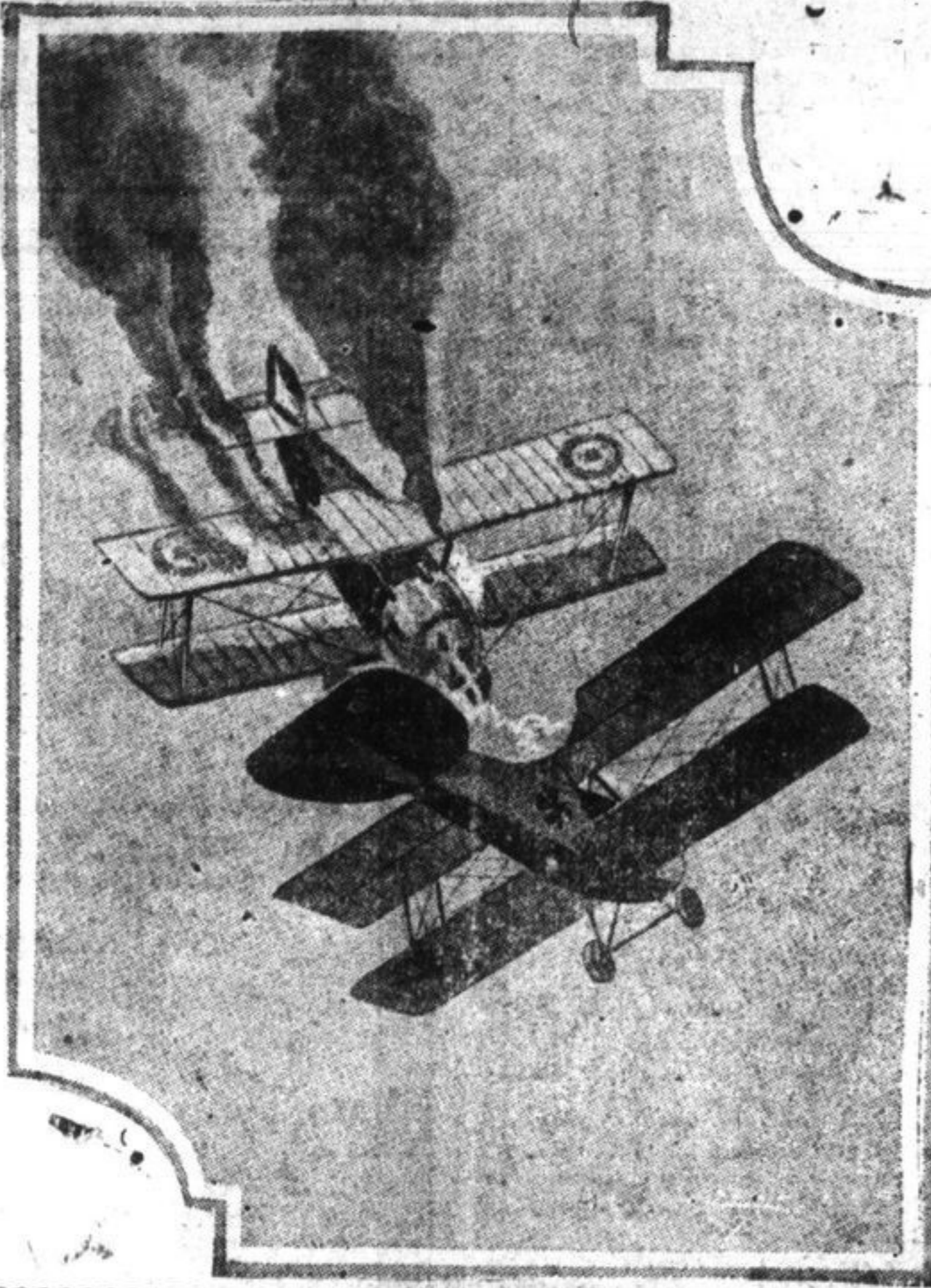


AVIATORS IN DARING FLIGHTS DEFY DEATH
