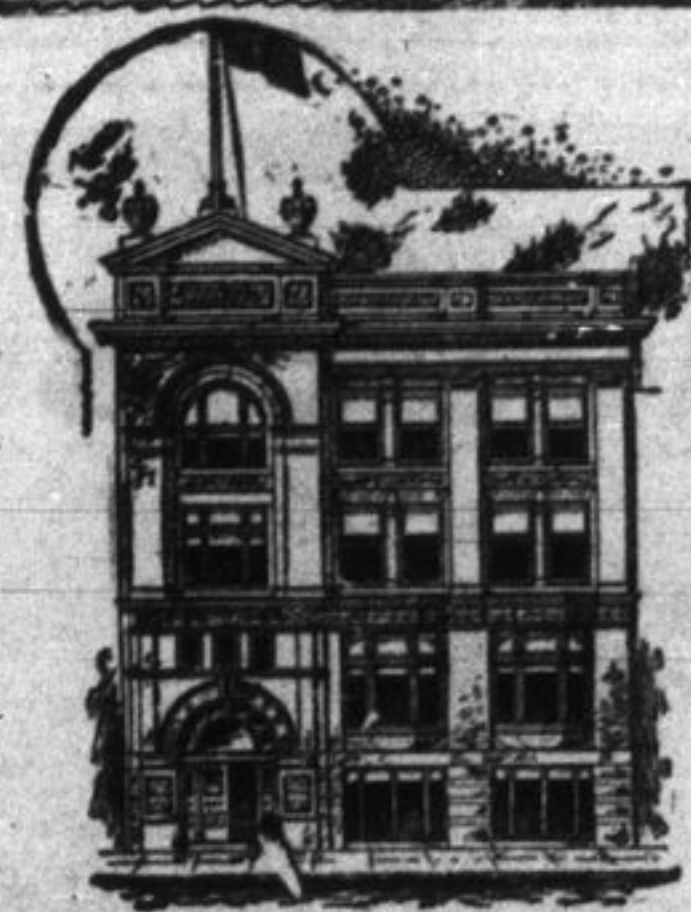

LIEUT. "JACK" GOOCH KILLED IN ACTION

Former Frontenac Star Pays The Supreme Sacrifice in France.

The sporting fraternity in Kingston will be grieved to learn of the death of "Jack" Gooch, who played with the Kingston Frontenacs two winters ago.

F. H. Gooch, Toronto, received the word on Tuesday that his son, Lieut. Frederick John Gooch, 6th Battery, 2nd Brigade, had paid the supreme price of his life.

Lieut. Gooch, who was twenty-four years of age, was an all-round athlete and in hockey, canoeing and boxing he took a leading part in Toronto where he was employed by the Canada Life Assurance Co.
