CAN CANCEL DRAFT

Major League Clubs Have Right if Player Enters Military Service.

The enrolling of ball players in the United States army and navy will have little effect financially on those clubs desiring to purchase or obtain by draft the players in leagues of lower classification. The National Baseball Commission has issued a notice to the effect that the status of all players obtained by recall under optional agreements would re main the same, no matter when the player was recalled for military or naval duty.

With men drafted from the ranks of the minors the draft price shall not be paid over until the player actually enters the service of the club which purchased him. In case the drafted player enters the military or naval service between the time he is drafted and the time he is ordered to report, the club which would have obtained his services has the privilege of cancelling its draft.


