Former Baseball Player Devises New Local Anasthetic.

Dr. Moriarity worked in the Lonthe early-part of the war when skilled professional men were in greatest demand, and has since then assisted in Canadian soldier hospitals.

Dr. Moriarty has devised a new local anesthetic which is being exensively used and is said to absoutely eliminate pain in most serious operations. He has offered it to the United States and Canadian Governments for army use and demonstrations are to be given at the local hespitals. In none of the operations in which it has been used did it leave the patient suffering from any of the nauseating effects often so pronounced after general anesthetics have been resorted to.
