SETTLERS IN WEST. Many Americans are moving to Western Canada.

Ottawa, Sept. 29.—The movement of settlers from the United States to the Canadian West continues to be of considerable volume, according to the statement of officials of the Dominion immigration department.

The entry of the United States into the war and the adoption of the selective draft system has not affected emigration to the Western provinces. This, it is explained, is due to the fact that the large majority of those who seek homes in Canada are well-to-do farmers above the military age with children too young to be affected by the conscription law.
