

**THE WORLD'S NEWS IN BRIEF FORM**

**Tidings From All Over Told in a Pithy and Pointed Way.**

The German Reichstag has adopted the bill for the rebuilding of the Kaiser's merchant fleet.

Daniel McNeil, K.C., Inverness, N.S., has been appointed District Court Judge for District No. 6, Antigonish, N.S.

Sir Francis J. S. Hopwood, Civil Lord of the Admiralty and Secretary to the Irish Convention, has been made a peer.

That rural eligibles in Essex county are not coming up for medical examination is the complaint of Major Stanbury.

The American Government has decided to refuse coal bunkering facilities to vessels bound for countries bordering on Germany. This shuts out Holland.

The Saskatchewan Advisory Council asks the Food Controller to exercise his powers to prevent discrimination against co-operative wholesalers and retailers.

General Alexieff, former commander-in-chief, will accompany the Russian delegation under Foreign Minister Tereschenko to the inter-allied conference in Paris.

That Canadians pay \$1,451,520 more for butter in a year than if the duty were taken off American butter is the statement of Mr. Fortier, himself a maker. He says the price is so high because Canadian dealers base it on high prices in the United States and add the duty.

**WILL DIVIDE \$152,888**

From the First Four Games of the World's Series.

Thursday's game was the last in which the players participate in the gate receipts, and later on the White Sox and Giants will divide \$152,888.68 as their share of the admission charges for the first four games. This sum will be awarded sixty per cent to the winning, and forty per cent to the losing team, the amounts being respectively \$91,733.15 and \$61,155.43. The attendance Thursday was 27,746, and the receipts \$63,742. Of this amount the players received \$24,420.88, the clubs \$11,473.56 each, and the National Commission \$6,374.20.
