NO NOMINATION WAS MADE INCIDENTS OF THE DAY

AT MEETING OF CITIENS HELD ON TUESDAY EVENING.

The Political Situation Was Discussed at Length—No Action Was Taken About a Nomination.

An enthusiastic and well attended meeting of citizens desirous of discussing the local political situation from both sides was held on Tuesday evening. Dr. W. L. Goodwin was appointed chairman and R. After some discussion and exchange of opinion a resolution was unanimously passed that the meeting was in favor of Union Government.

As there was a great divergence of opinion as to the method of nominating a candidate and also as to who the candidate should be, it was decided to adjourn without action being taken.

On the application of Alexander Auer for an order quashing the conviction registered against him in the Toronto Police Court, Justice Brington at Osogode Hall on Tuesday reserved judgment. Auer is a Finnlander, who came to this country in 1904 and was naturalized in 1909. He was sentenced to two years' hard labor at Portsmouth penitentiary on a charge of making statements likely to spread disaffection to His Majesty or to interfere with the success of His Majesty's forces.
