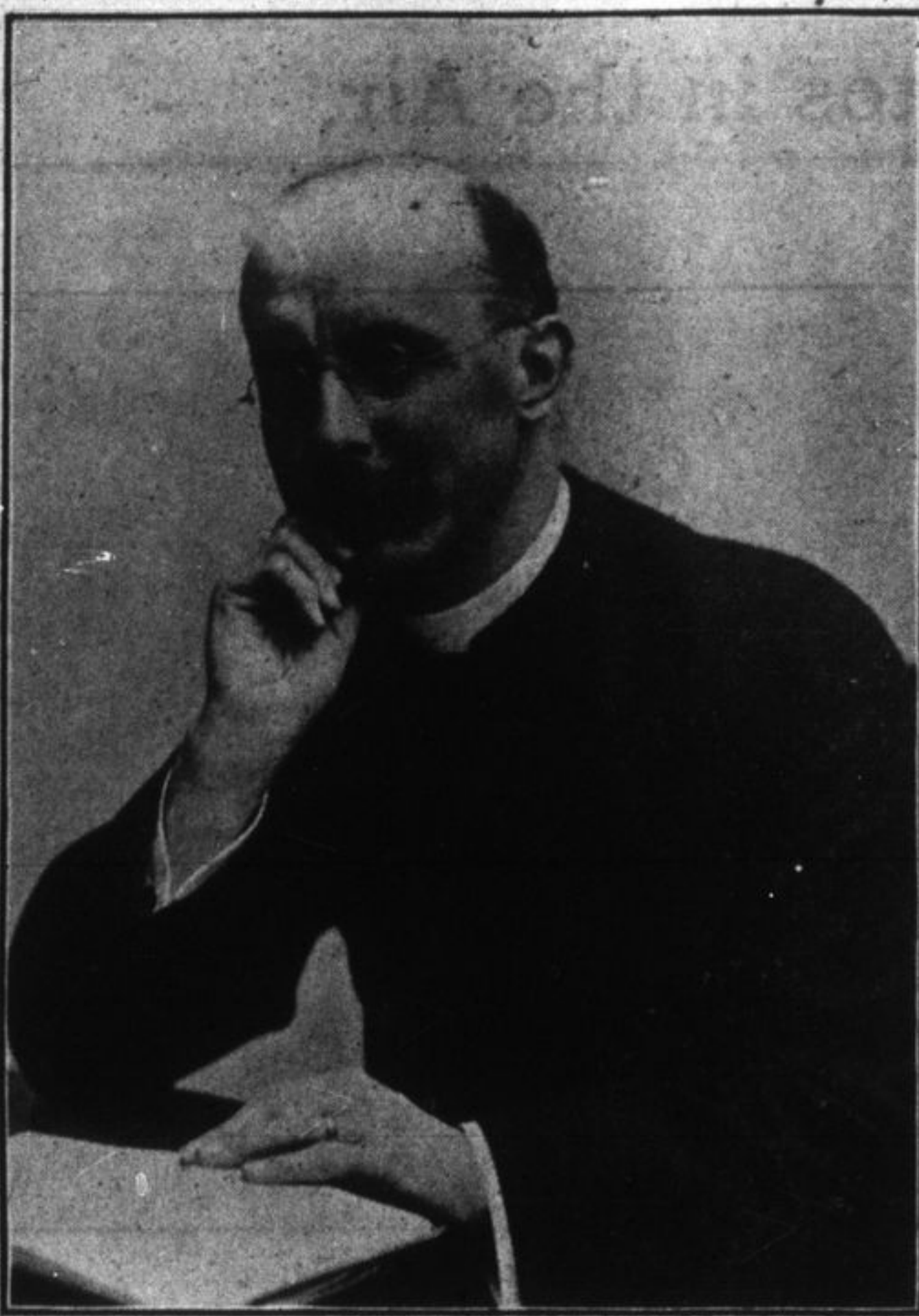
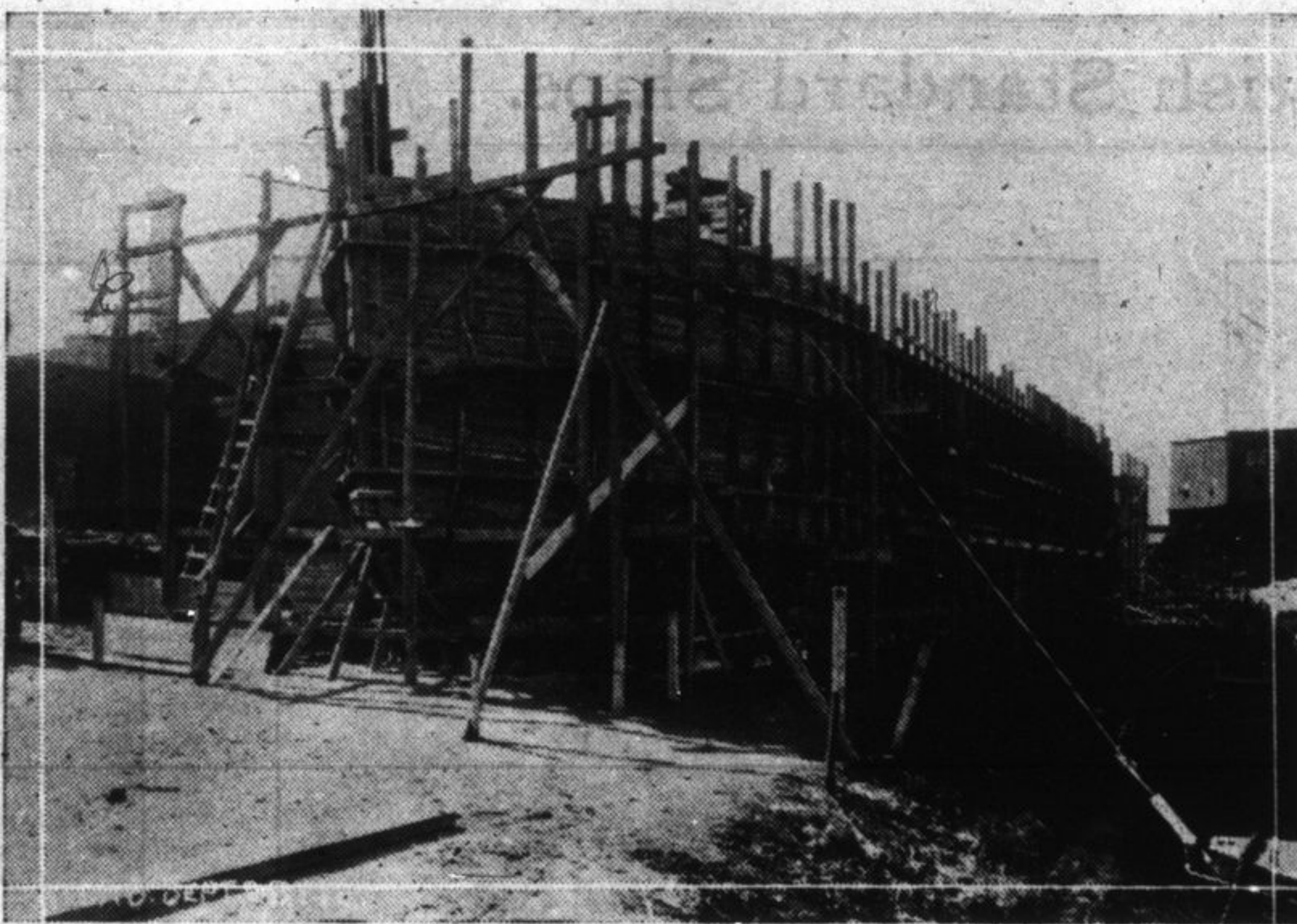


World Famous Aviator and Bride - Other Views of International Importance

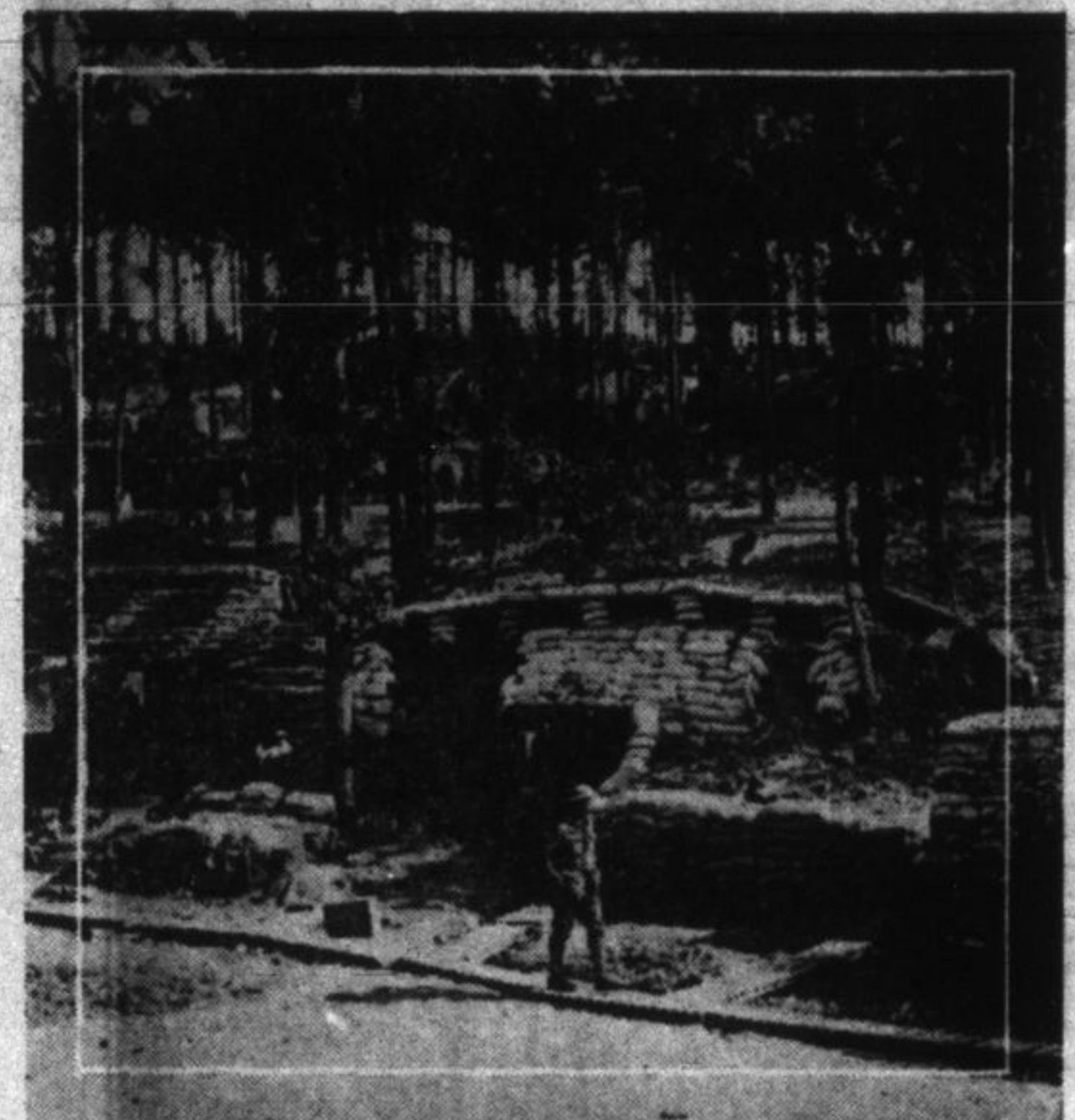
Building their prison camp. German prisoners in England constructing their winter quarters.



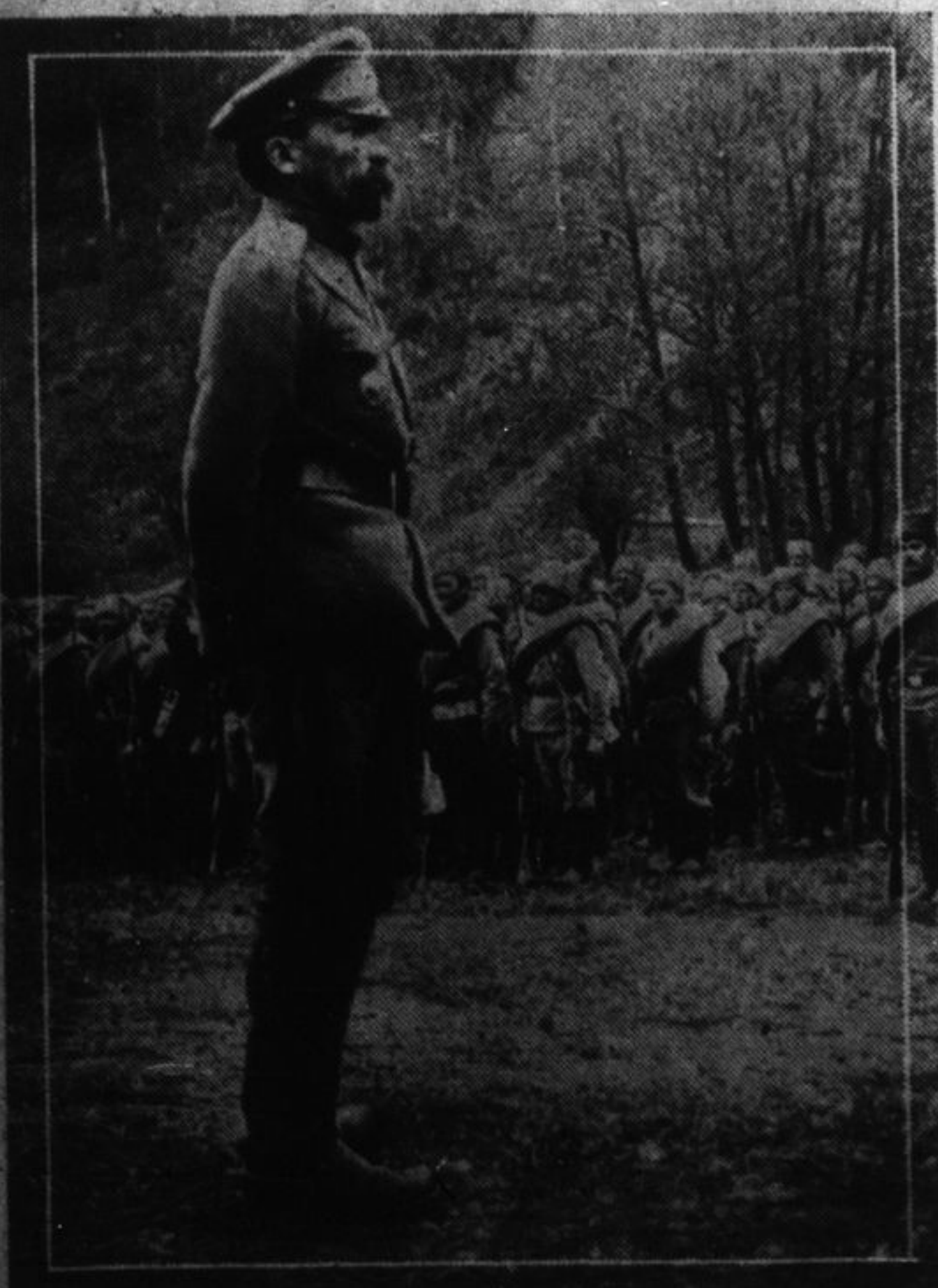
The "Sammies" are beginning to feel at home in France. Some of the United States troops peeling potatoes at a training camp.
