CAPT. PAPINEAU KILLED

Grandson of Papineau, Who Took Part in Rebellion of 1837.

Montreal, Nov. 5.—Private advices from England announce the death in action of Capt. Talbot Papineau, M.C. of the Princess Patricia Canadian Light Infantry.

He was killed in the attack on Passchendaele. Capt. Papineau was a grandson of Louis Joseph Papineau, who took a leading part in the rebellion in Quebec of 1837. He was a Rhodes scholar.
