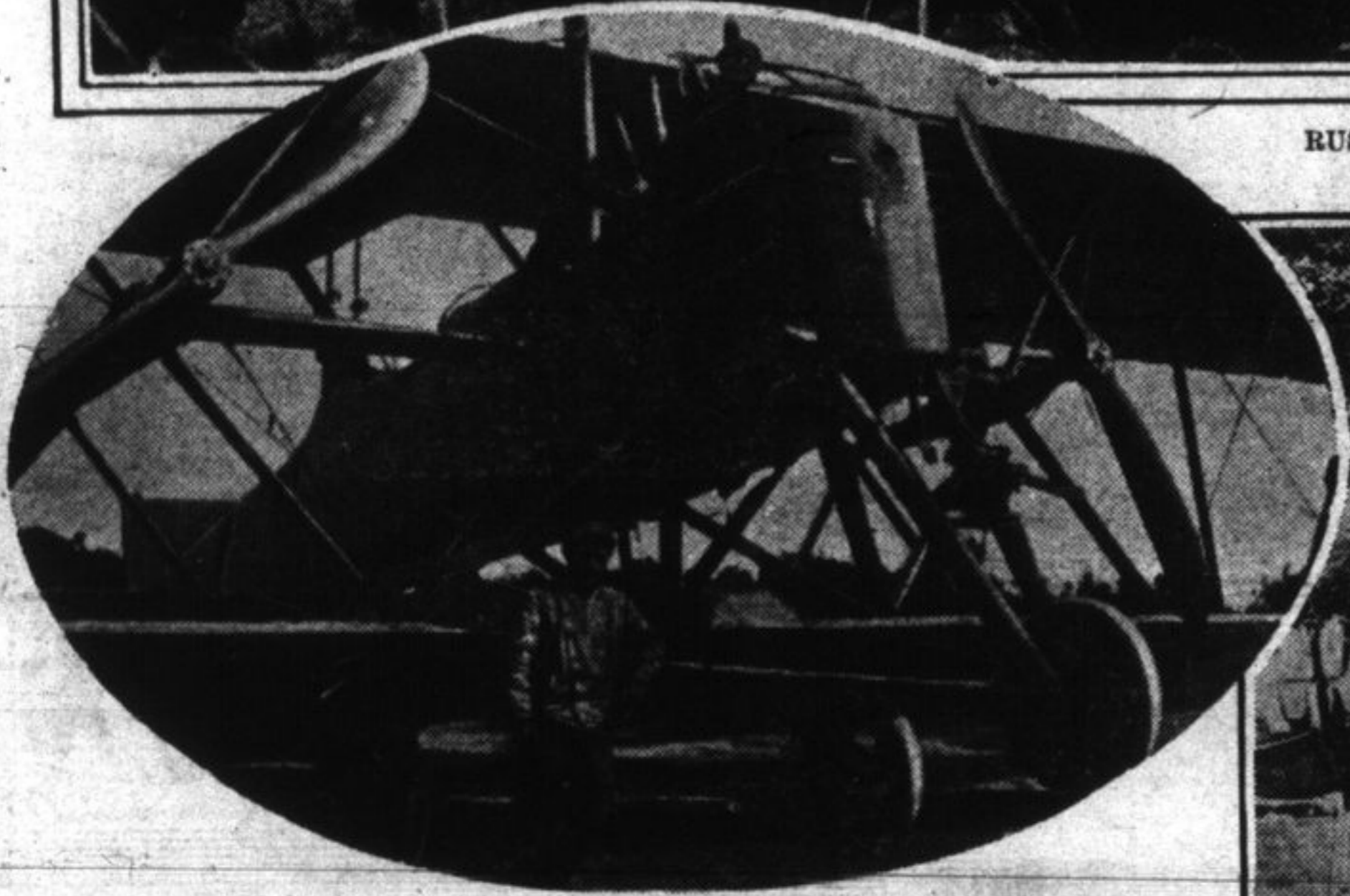


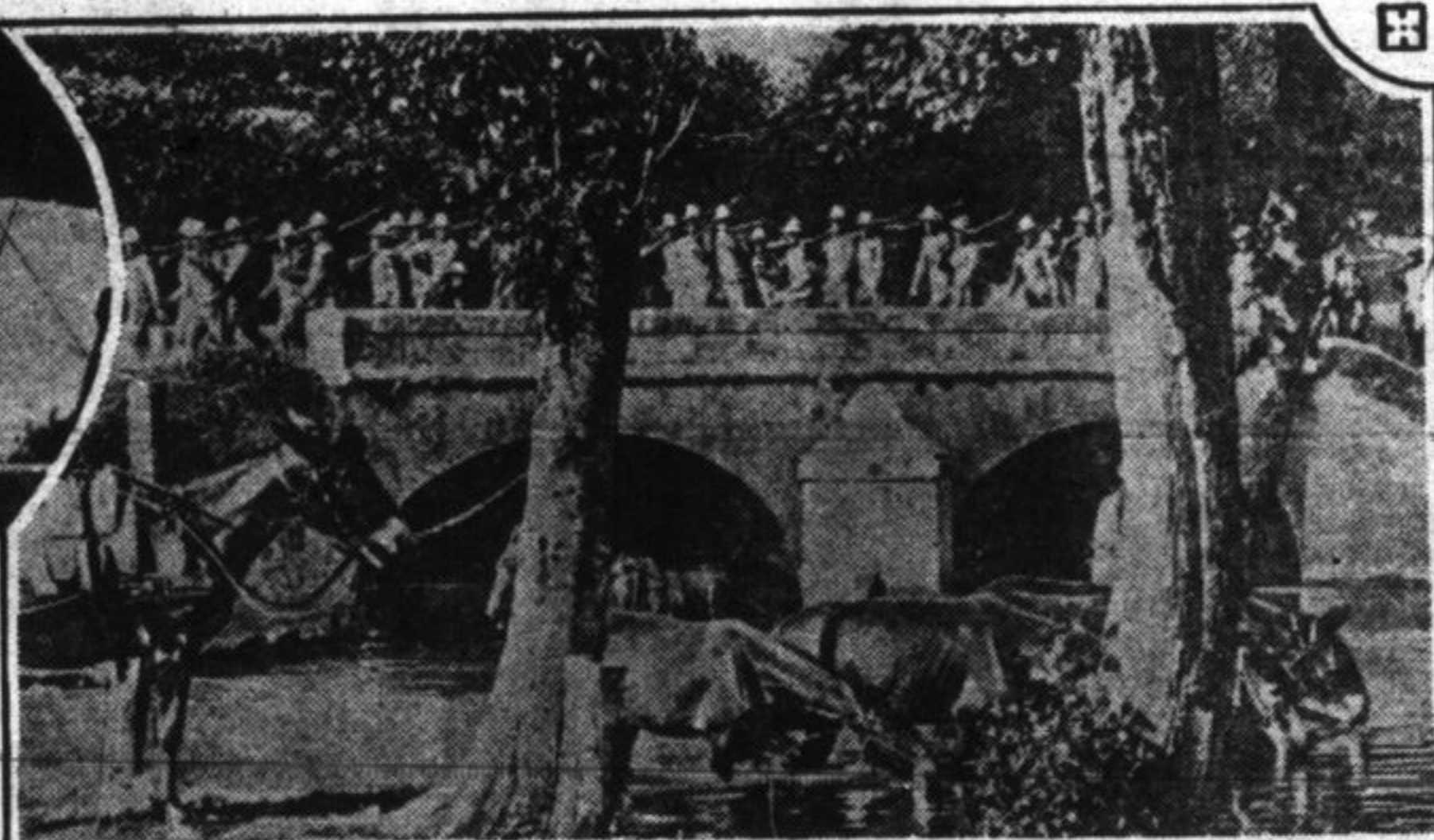
Swearing Allegiance to Kerensky - British Tank in N.Y. - "Sammies" in France

Wireless on aircraft. Showing (in front) the small screw which, actuated by the air, drives the dynamo for the electric current.



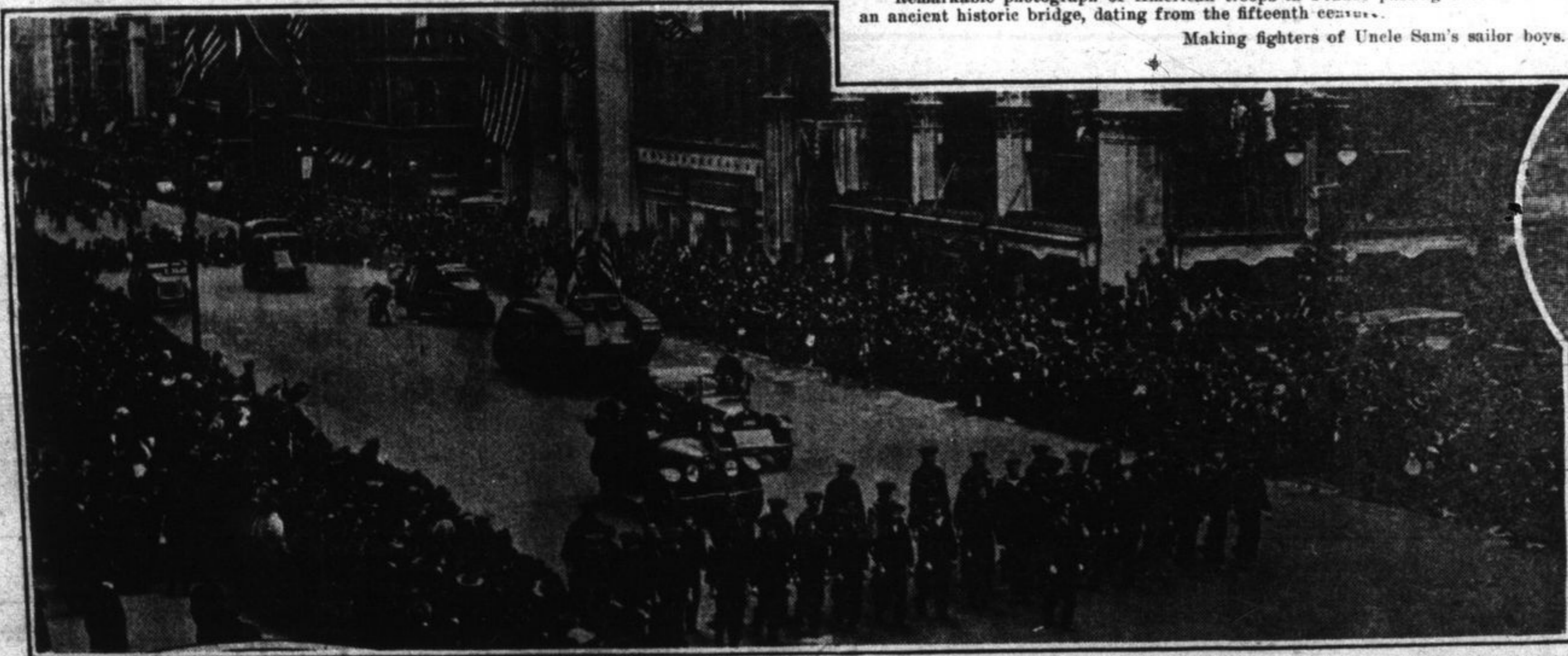
Remarkable photograph of American troops in France passing over an ancient historic bridge, dating from the fifteenth century.

Building an oven and wearing slippers made from a German aeroplane tyre. An ingenious Canadian cook, in support lines.



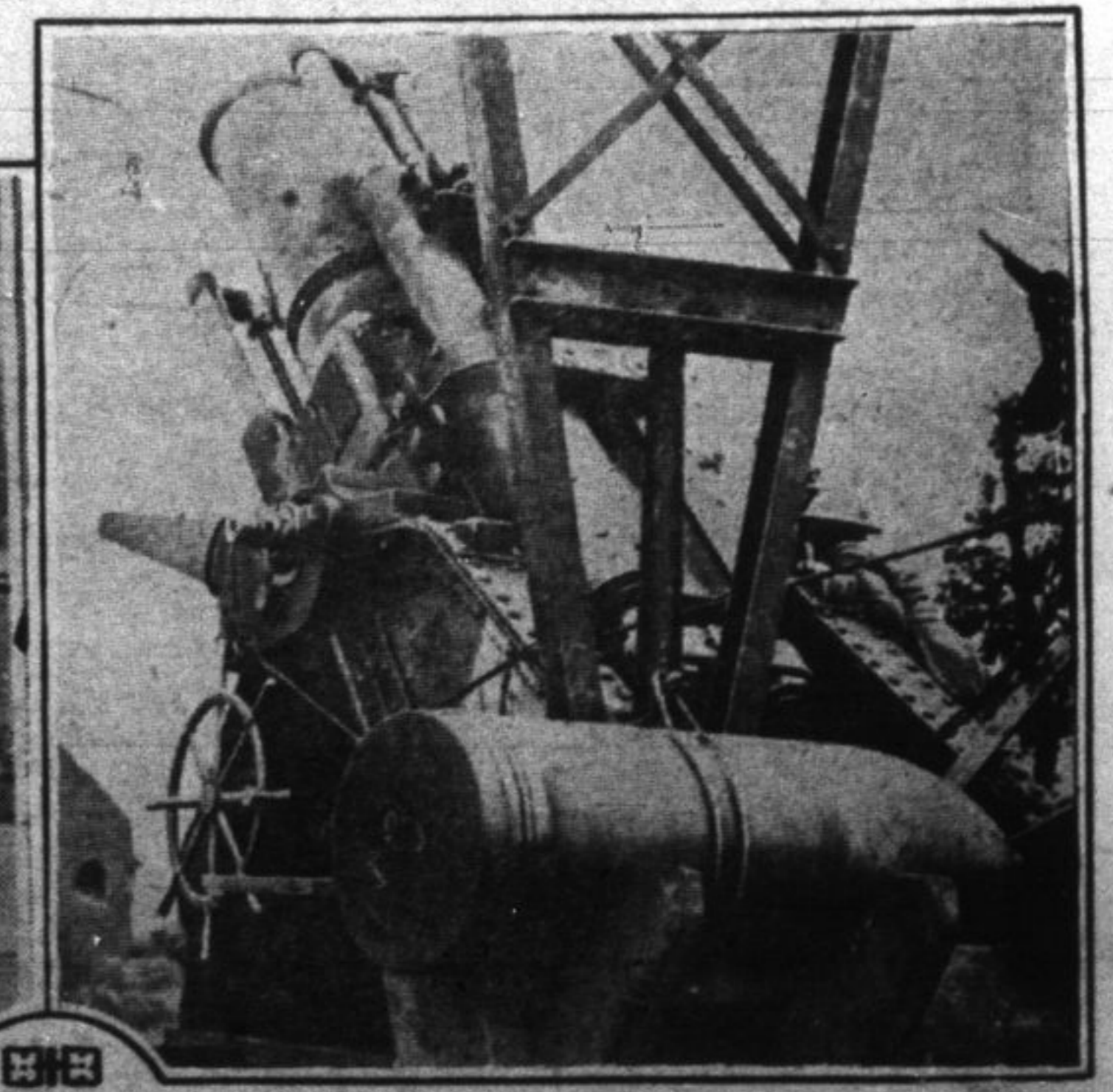
