DR. FRASER AT QUEEN'S INCIDENTS OF THE DAY

SPOKE ELOQUENTLY OF VALOROUS DEEDS OF CANADIANS.

Described the Preparations For the Battle of the Somme, and Urged Canadians to Carry On.

Rev. Thurlow Fraser, D.D., for some months a chaplain with the Canadian forces at Ypres and on the Somme river in France, thrilled a large congregation at the afternoon service in Convocation Hall on Sunday. His address, which emphasized the necessity of the people in Canada to "carry on" at this time and support the soldiers fighting in France, was punctuated with incidents showing the spirit that exists among the Canadian troops.

The preparation for the great battle of the Somme was vividly described, and one could almost see as on a screen the gigantic battle camp of France making ready for the supreme test. In the battles they are fighting for the freedom of the world the Canadians, like the other soldiers of the warring nations, have come up against the stern realities of their task, and realize the need for the comfort of the divine spirit. One of the most interesting of Dr. Fraser's reminiscences was the description of the sacrament service on the battlefield. He had just finished picturing the mighty preparations for the impending clash of arms in the battle of the Somme. At nine o'clock on the Sunday morning on which the battle was to begin a great semi-circle of thousands of soldiers was formed and the sacrament of the Lord's supper performed to those who wished to partake of it. Two ammunition boxes formed a table, and on these were placed the symbols of Christ's body and blood, who had sacrificed Himself for them as they were willing to sacrifice themselves for those at home and for all they held dear. It was an inspiring scene to see those meek souls in the presence of the Almighty, seeking the consolation of the Divine Spirit, and many of them partaking of the last Lord's supper on earth before they went to join their Master in the realms paradisaical—a holy sacrifice on the altar of right and civilization.

A YOUTH HELD UP IN MACDONALD PARK

Two Men Grabbed Him But Found He Carried an Empty Pocketbook.
