

Before polling day the electors will have information which will enable them to act judiciously in this matter. There has been a compulsory registration of the members of class A in conformity with the call. and the exemption courts are deciding upon "who can be best relieved from the occupations in which they are engaged and service in the field under conditions as honorable as those which surround their fellow. Canadians in uniform." The proces of selection is slow enough, because it is being exactingly done, and with a result which, thus far, has been very disappointing. Evidently there are few eligibles in class A who can be spared from their present positions. and class B will be called out in order to secure the required complement of men.

The premier says the Union Government is pledged to many reforms; to an extirpation of the patronage evil; to economy in every branch of the public service; to necessary and reasonable transportation facilities: to the greater taxation of wealth: to the wider franchise for women; and to the solution of problems that concern the returned soldiery. The outlook for the Union Government, be it said, is not too rosy at this juncture. There are differences among the people, conservatives and liberals. that cannot be reconciled, and it is possible that the pending election may not end the difficulties of the hour. A second appeal may follow at once unless the majority in favor of the union is large and of a most decided character.

Mr. Bennett, an able man. but not at all tractable, politicallya high kicker at times and under spectacular circumstances -- may later find himself in the changed conditions which will follow the war. He is a rich man, and has been in parliamentary life simply for the pleasure or excitement or gratification which it afforded.
