NEW ORGAN IN ST. JAMES'

USED FOR THE FIRST TIME ON SUNDAY.

Organ Gave Splendid Service—Canon O'Meara Makes Appeal For Better Church Attendance.

The new organ, recently installed in St. James' Church, was used for the first time at the services on Sunday, and gave splendid service. The organ, which cost \$2,500, has a beautiful tone, and added much to the musical programme of the day. Mrs. A. R. B. Williamson presided at the organ and the choir was quite large. In the evening the choir rendered a beautiful anthem, "O God Our Help in Ages Past." The new organ gave infinite satisfaction. There was a large congregation present at both services and all present were delighted with it.

The special preacher of the day was Canon O'Meara, principal of Wellesley College, Toronto, and he delivered two forceful sermons. In the morning he spoke on the words, "We Would See Jesus," and in the evening, "I Am With You Always." In his morning discourse, Canon O'Meara referred to the fact that during the week the people came in contact every day with newspapers and magazines and on the Sunday they were afforded the opportunity of hearing the gospel preached and pointed out how the day of rest could be made most beneficial in the listening to discourses and in Bible Study. This was all the more appreciated after the week's work.

In the evening Canon O'Meara made a strong appeal for a larger attendance at church services, pointing out that at times the attendance at churches was very small. Some people were quite lukewarm in regard to their worship, and the preacher appealed for more earnestness in their worship.

Dr. Farmer in First Baptist.

Rev. Dr. Farmer, Dean of the Faculty of Theology at McMaster University, was the speaker at the First Baptist Church on Sunday. He gave his congregations two inspiring sermons. In the evening the doctor chose, "Being Near the Kingdom of God" as his subject. He pointed out that the man described by that passage had apprehended the religious truths of God, had realized that there were two commandments, "Love to himself and to the other man," and had thus caught the inner spirit of Christianity and become near to the kingdom of God. While the Sunday school teacher, parent or some one else may bring the child near to the kingdom, it remains at that point a matter of personal responsibility. The kingdom can only be entered by a person who forewears allegiance to self and sacrifices all to Christ.

At Salvation Army Citadel.
Colonel and Mrs. Hargraves, the former being social secretary of the Salvation Army at Toronto, spent the week-end in the city. Col. Hargraves preached on Saturday night and at two services on Sunday. On Sunday evening Mrs. Hargraves took the service.

Recital at St. Luke's.

At the close of the service last evening the choir of St. Luke's church gave a recital which was greatly enjoyed by the large congregation. The singing of the choir as a whole was "par excellence" and the parts being exceptionally well-balanced. The evenness of tone, and the shading were particularly fine. The solos sung by Mrs. Turner, Mrs. Horton, Miss Spencer, Mr. Graves, Mr. Nicol and D. Couper were all well received, as were also a duet by Mrs. Horton and Corpl. Lightheart, and a violin selection by Miss Daisy Johnson. Much praise is due the organist and director, B. Couper, and the very efficient choir for the success of the recital.

A Strong Sermon.

Rev. J. D. Ellis in Queen street Methodist church on Sunday evening preached on unity in Canada in war times. Party politics were helpful in peace times but in war times division was suicidal. He called for loyalty and devotion to the Empire cause. He said the best men and the best papers stood for union, for cohesion and in this connection applauded the Whig's stand for a Union Government. It was patriotic and ennobling. The Canadian soldiers at the front called for unity and support from those at home. In this time of stress differences of views and policies made for the benefit of the enemy. A united front was Canada's only salvation.
