when basting it in armhole. To make the skirt, slash to the left of center-front along small "o" perforations and finish the edges for closing. Close back seam. Form tucks creasing on crosslines of slot perforations, stitch the upper tuck 31/2 inches from folded edge, the center tuck 4 inches from folded edge and the lower tuck 5 inches from folded edge. Turn hem at lower edge on small "o" perforations and stitch 6 inches from turned edge. Gather upper edge between "T" perforations. Adjust skirt to position, stitching the upper edge along crossline of small "o" perforations in underbody, with center-fronts and center-backs even; bring small "o" perforation at upper edge of skirt to under-arm

to the side edge of vest. Then take the outer plait side edge of front placing "T" on corresponding small "o" perfora-tions and tack. Close under-arm seam as notched. Arrange over underhody with center-fronts and ce ter backs even; single small "o" perforations indicate center-front of outer-waist. Tack the pointed ends of front and back to the trimming


