HYDRO POWER SOON HERE

IT IS EXPECTED TO REACH KINGSTON IN TEN DAYS

Welcome Announcement at Utilities Commission Meeting - The Street Lighting Should Be Curtailed, Says Commissioner Chown,

At a meeting of the Public Utilities Commission on Monday afternoon Manager Folger announced that the Hydro-Electric Commission would have Kingston connected up with Trent power in about ten days. The electrical apparatus so long in coming has all arrived and is being erected at the sub-station here. It was expected that hydro power would have been supplied to Kingston early last August, but there were delays in getting the machinery contracted for, owing to war conditions. The coming of hydro power will be a great help to the Kingston electrical plant as the load in December will be the heaviest in its history.

Commissioner Chown, in speaking about the city's street lighting, thought the City Council should practice more economy, Instead of erecting more lights, as it is doing, it should reduce its street lighting bill Princess street should have a good deal less than half of its "white way" lit after midnight. Mr. Chown hoped Mayor Hughes would prevail on the City Council to make a cut in these strenuous war times.
