



Separate skirts of brown broadcloth velours, etc., are in great demand and a chic one-piece model is shown here The deep tuck and pockets may be omitted, if desired, but they add to the smartness of the skirt. In medium size, 3% yards 54-inch broadcloth are required for the design.

The construction of a one-piece skirt is necessarily simple, so that the variest neophyte need not fear to attempt it. Then, there is the construction guide to further simplify matte rs. Close the back seam of the skirt from the lower large "O" perforation to lower edge of skirt and finish edges above the perforation for a placket. Form tuck creasing on crossline of slot perforations, stitch 4 inches from folded edge. Turn hem at lower edge of skirt on small "o" perforations. Gather upper edge of skirt between "T" perforations.

The large "O" perforation in the stay indicates the upper edge. Take up darts bringing together and stitching along corresponding small "o" perforations. Adjust stay to position underneath skirt, with center-fronts even; bring back edge of stay to canter-back. Stitch upper edges of skirt and stay together; bringing the small "o" perforations at upper edge of skirt to the 2 darts in stay near
