"JACK" MILLS MET DEATH

ON THE 30TH OF OCTOBER—STRUCK BY SHELL. A Chum Tells of His Death—Deceased Was a Well-Known Kingston Student and Hockey Player.

"Jack" Mills, one of the best known of Kingston's students and athletes, has given his life in the war, according to a letter received on Monday by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Mills, 129 University avenue. The letter was sent by Lieut. Milner, P.P.C.L.L., after a conversation with "Jack's" chum, who was wounded and is now in England. It seems that "Jack" was struck by a shell on the morning of October 30th and killed instantly. This took place when an advance was being made.

"Jack" Mills enlisted three years ago in Queen's Engineers and went overseas with the reinforcing company to the Princess Pats, being in the wiring division of that famous regiment. Some time ago he was wounded in the left shoulder.

The dead hero was born in Kingston twenty-two years ago and attended the local schools and Collegiate Institute and also took one year's work in Science at Queen's. In sporting circles he was always prominent, being in 1913 and 1914 goalkeeper for Frontenac hockey team.

There is left to mourn his loss his parents, one sister, Miss Florence May, at home, and five brothers, Dr. R. M. in Brooklyn; George W. and Herbert H. at home, Thomas Stanley in Ottawa, and Gordon K. with the Flying Corps in Texas.

Pte. P. Moore Wounded. Mrs. Moore, 17 Upper Charles street, has received a letter from her brother-in-law, Lieut. Lawrence Moore, R. E., that her husband, Pte. Peter Moore, who went overseas with the 146th Battalion of Kingston, was wounded in the right shoulder on November 16th and is in No. 16 General Hospital, Treport, France. Pte. Moore was formerly an employe of the Davis tannery. This is the second time Pte. Moore has been wounded. The first time was in April 19th last, when he received wounds in the right arm.
