PARCELS FOR OVERSEAS INCIDENTS OF THE DAY

NEW REGULATIONS GO INTO FORCE BEGINNING OF YEAR.

Parcels Must Bear "Coupon" Issued by the Prisoners of War Department, Canadian Red Cross Society, London, Eng.—One Hundred Pounds Every Four Weeks. The Post Office Department has issued regulations regarding the sending of parcels overseas to prisoners of war, which will go into force on January 1st, 1918. A new scheme, instituted by the British Government, states that all parcels from Canada to officer prisoners of war in Germany or Austria-Hungary, containing food-stuffs, can only be accepted for forward transmission by the postal service if they bear a "coupon" issued by the prisoners of war department, Canadian Red Cross Society, London, Eng. Under the new arrangements, the amount of food-stuffs which may be sent to an officer prisoner of war during four weeks must not exceed one hundred pounds. Of this total the prisoners of war department of the Canadian Red Cross Society will send to each interned Canadian soldier, including those attached to other Canadian units, not less than six ten-pound parcels each four weeks. The remaining forty pounds of food-stuffs per four weeks may be sent personally by relatives in Canada, but each parcel must bear a coupon which can be obtained on application from the prisoners of war department, Canadian Red Cross Society, London, Eng. The right to send food parcels rests with the next of kin, but may be transferred by the latter or by the prisoner of war himself to any person. It is advisable that application should be made to the prisoners of war department, Canadian Red Cross Society, London, Eng., for the necessary coupons for parcels packed personally at the earliest possible moment. These coupons are to be used for foodstuffs only, and no coupons can be used for amounts under ten pounds. If, therefore, it is desired to despatch a parcel weighing less than ten pounds, an ordinary coupon must be used and the parcel counts as one of the four permissible in four weeks.

Parcels for officers interned in Bulgaria and Turkey come under the new scheme. Owing, however, to the difficulty of postal communication, it is not advisable to send many parcels to officers in Turkish camps. Supplies can be purchased in Asia Minor, and it is better to remit money to prisoners rather than send many parcels. This new scheme relates only to parcels containing foodstuffs, and does not affect in any way the present regulations governing the transmission of parcels to prisoners of war other than officers which regulations remain unchanged.

Cunning's digital dexterity and other perplexing manipulations, including trunk and cabinet mysteries, have not been surpassed.
