"Liberals who hold the views I do and who favor the Union idea are not deserting Liberalism. On the contrary, they are but giving expression to and converting into action higher ideals of true Liberalism. Lloyd George, the greatest Liberal of modern times, did not hesitate when the great calamity fell upon Britain. With him the interests of the state and of humanity were paramount. It should be so with us. Surely in the present great crisis we can lay aside our party feelings and follow along the path of duty. "Is it not possible to temporarily forget the questions which have separated us in the past? Why should we be divided into two hostile camps when the enemy without is hammering at the gates?
