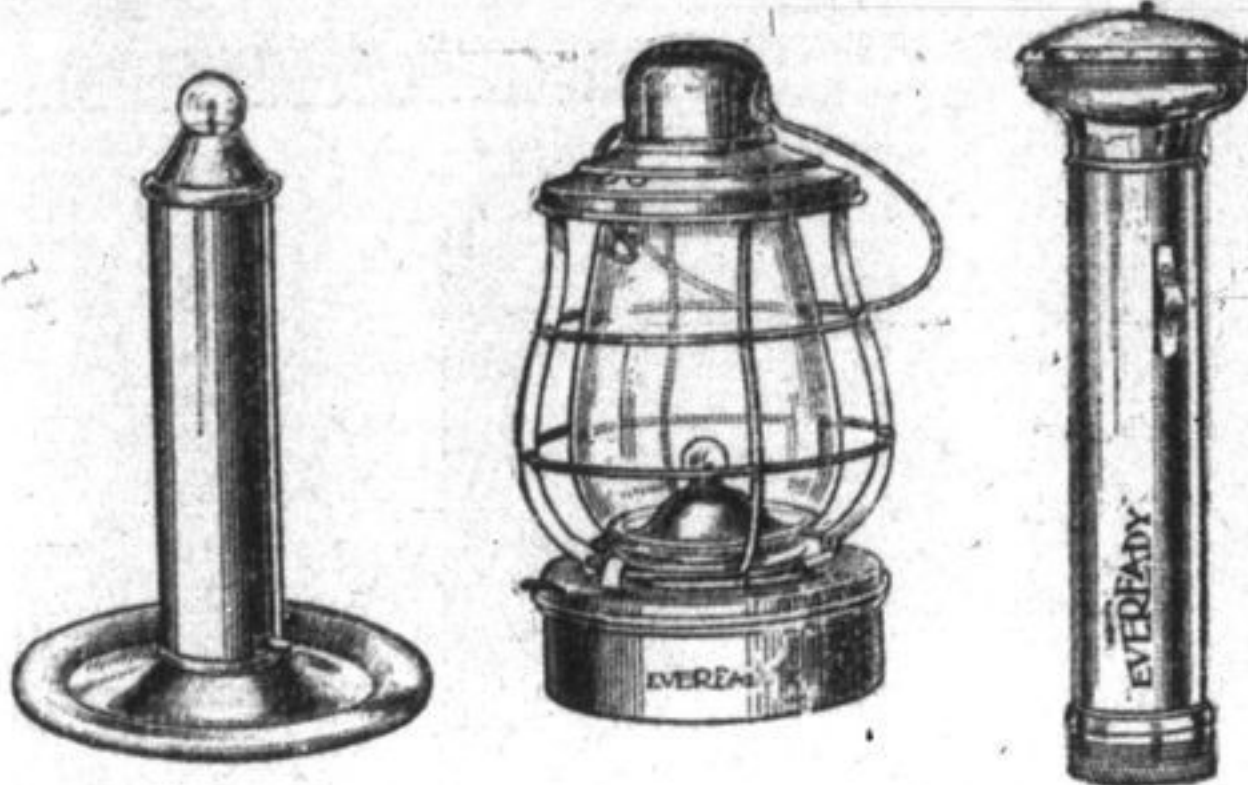
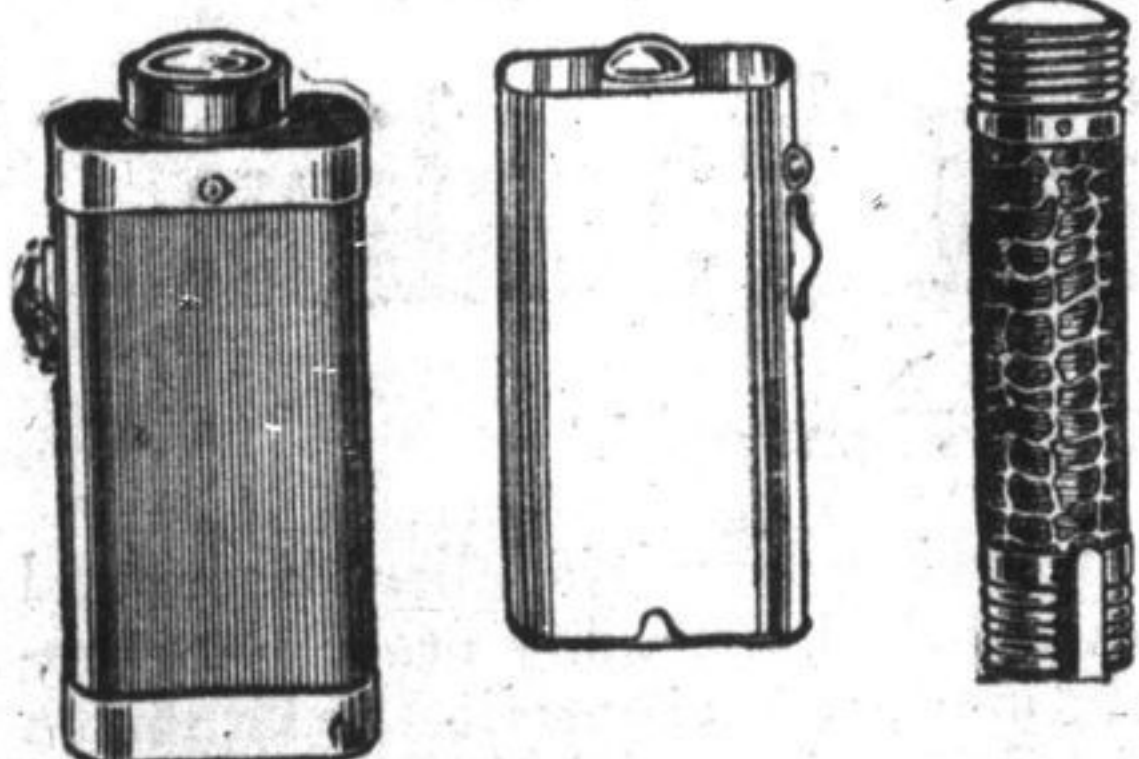

Sporting Notes

George Sisler, the St. Louis Browns' star player, has intimated that he may volunteer his services to Uncle Sam.

Benny Leonard, lightweight champion, knocked out Gene Delmont, of Memphis, Tenn., last night at St. Paul, in the eighth round of a scheduled ten-round bout. It was the first time Delmont was ever knocked out.

Jimmy Shelvin, club promoter, of Cincinnati, has offered \$20,000 for a bout between Freddie Welsh and Benny Leonard.

Charley White, the Chicago lightweight, has been ordered to Camp Custer at Battle Creek, Mich., to become boxing instructor.

Coroner P. J. Byrne's inquest into the death of "El Paso" Jimmy Wilson, who died at Cleveland from a fractured skull, owing to a match with "Whitey" Wenzel, of Pitts-

burg, last week, developed that all precautions against accident had been taken, and that Wenzel was in no way to blame.

Ted Meredith, the Olympic 800 meter champion, and record holder for the quarter and half mile distances, is now an aviator in France. Tommy Lennon, the University of Pennsylvania sprinter, is also with him.

Charles Weeghman, president of the Chicago Cubs, is of the same opinion as Garry Herrman that the player limit in the National League should be reduced to eighteen men next season.

Barney Dreyfus has a new form of world's series. He would have the National and American League teams play a series of home and home games. The plan is identical with that as was arranged between the International and the American Association last season.

"Australia Loses Another." Another famous Australian athlete has made the great sacrifice, for, according to late reports from the European front, Cecil Healy was killed in a recent charge.

At the time of his death, Healy was an adjutant, having achieved an excellent record for bravery and resourcefulness under stress of severe fighting. Healy was one of the best of the Australian middle distance swimmers, and at the time of his death held several Antipodean records at distances ranging from 150 to 400 yards. At one time he possessed the world's record for 150 yards in open water, but his time was bettered by Duke Kahanamoku, the Hawaii expert.
