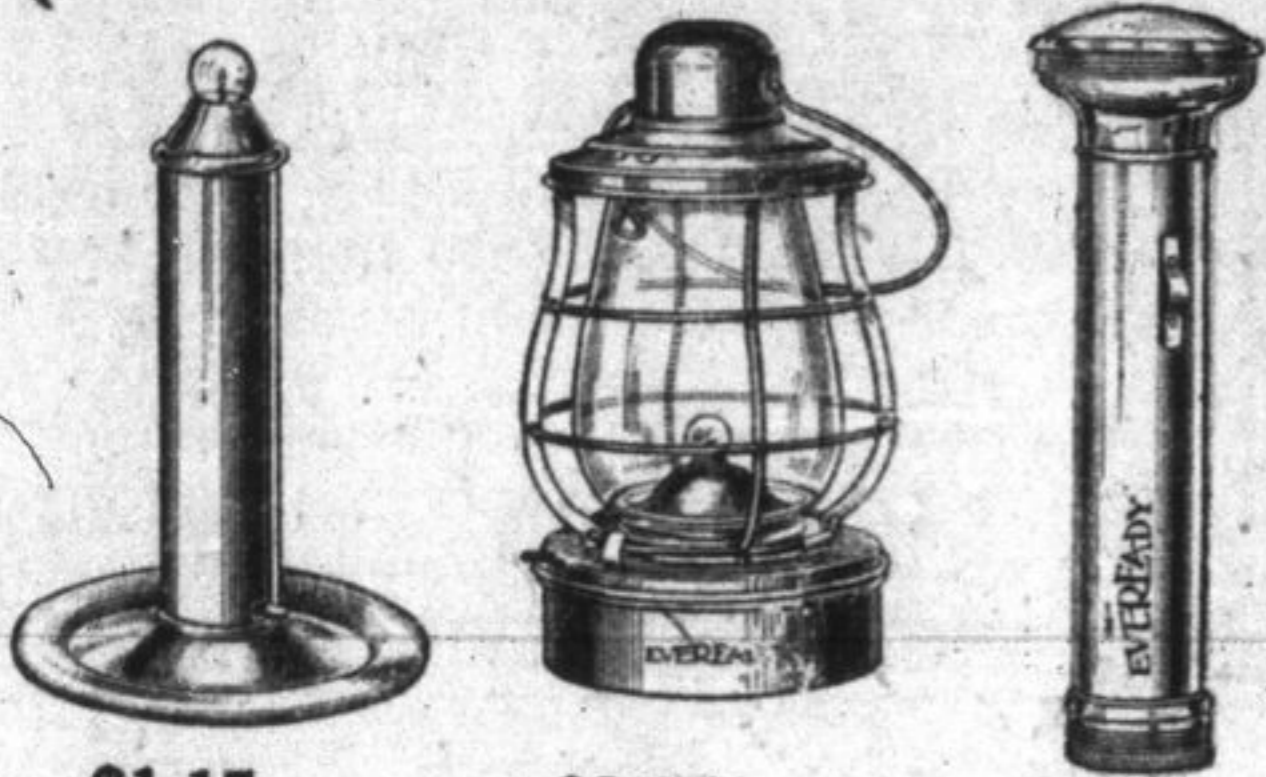
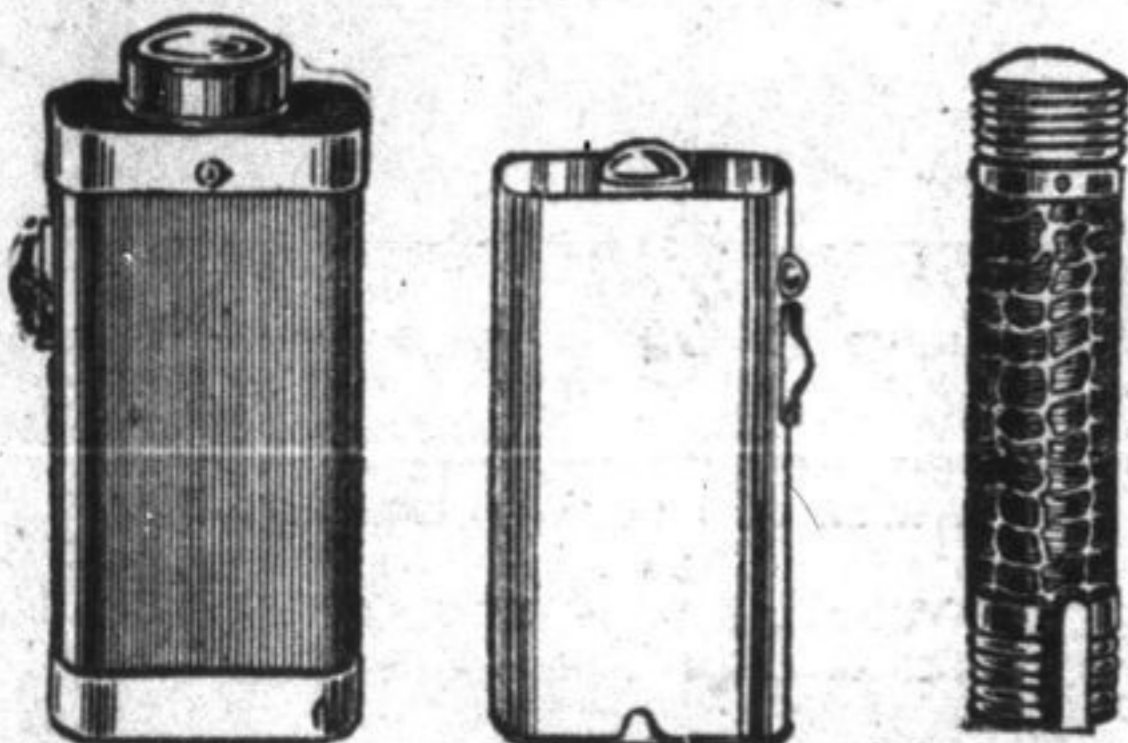

Griffiths is Another Who May Retire From Pacific Coast League.

Two, and possibly three, veterans will be missing from the line-ups of the coast clubs when the hockey season opens next month. Frank Patrick, President of the Pacific Coast Hockey Association, has announced his permanent retirement as a player, while Mallem, who is in California also announces that he is through with the game. ### THE MAJOR LEAGUERS NOW AFTER LAJOIE

Leader of the Champion Leafs Is Wanted by Three American League Clubs.

Closely following the announcement of Honus Wagner's permanent retirement from baseball comes a story that Napoleon Lajoie, the Dutchman's ancient rival, will return to the American League next season—possibly as a member of the New York team.

A year ago, when Lajoie received an honorable discharge from the American League after fifteen years of continuous service, Wagner's name was blazoned forth as that of the most enduring big leaguer. Everybody thought Lajoie had really outlived his usefulness. But Wagner made a failure of his "comeback," while the Frenchman, who managed the Toronto team, led the International League in batting, with the splendid average of .380, also leading in total hits and total bases.

Thus it would appear that Lajoie can still hit good pitching, and with so many vacancies in the big leagues next season an athlete of his ability will be more than welcome.

At least three American League clubs are willing to pay Lajoie a good salary next season, and possibly one National League Club might engage him as manager. Put "Larry's" future depends on the future of the International League, which may be settled here next week.
