THE NEW PRINCIPAL GRANT

WHO IS HEAD OF UPPER CANADA COLLEGE, TORONTO.

The Song of the Great Queen's Principal—He Has Inherited in No Small Measure His Father's Qualities.

 While a new era is opening in the political life of Canada, little short of a new era has been opened in the educational life of the country by the installation of Major W. L. Grant as principal of Upper Canada College on Tuesday. Major Grant is the son of a great Canadian, the late principal of Queen's University, a man of great breadth of view and general magnanimity and large heartedness. Major Grant appears to have inherited no small measure of these qualities, and there is that in his military career which will appeal to the imagination and respect of the genus puer.

There is already a noble tradition associated with Upper Canada College. Its founder, Sir John Colborne, afterwards Lord Seaton, was a veteran of the Duke of Wellington's campaigns; and whatever may be said about militarism, there is no one knows its dangers so well, nor so able to discriminate with regard to its virtues, as a good soldier. Canada has no desire for militarism, and it is to be hoped no need, but there is something finer than militarism in the character of a soldier that must not be omitted from the character of a nation.

Major Grant, in his inaugural address, dwelt upon some of those aspects of Canadian life that depend for their perfection on the fidelity with which the young men of the country are trained to love and venerate great national ideals. The recently issued roll of U.C.C. old boys, upon which Prof. Young has spent so much loving care, testifies to the pride and honor which the old school may always feel in those who went forth from her halls. In an eloquent passage Major Grant said:

"It is not of the living I think most; it is the dead. When you look at the names, they're like the roll-call of many an old class in this school. Some stately memorial to them there must be, to be seen and known by all men, while Upper Canada College endures. Those old boys live just as long as they are a memory and an inspiration to us. What sort of Canada shall we show our dead, when they ask us how we have kept the trust?"

From another point of view he was equally worthy of attention. "Above all things we must be Canadians in thought, word and deed. We must not be narrowly Canadian, nor narrowly Ontarian." He quoted Milton's words on England as a fit inspiration for Canada: "A nation not slow and dull—a nation of prophets, sages and warriors."

There is not the slightest doubt that the boys who pass through Upper Canada College exercise a commanding influence upon the national life; and it is of all things important that such fine ideals, such high aspirations as these should be commended in a practical and acceptable way to the youth of the country, as there is but little doubt they will be under the guidance of the new principal. A public school of the type of Upper Canada College falls entirely of its purpose if it become merely an educational institution. Its chief and most influential function is the rearing of a superb national character on a sound educational basis.

THE SOLDIERS' VOTE MAY DEFEAT EULER

Insult to Premier Borden at Kitchener Resented by Overseas Soldiers.

London, Dec. 20.—One of the remarkable features of the soldiers' vote, both at the camps in England and on the front in France and Flanders, is the large number of members of various units from Canada who insisted on recording their ballots for the Unionist candidate who was "running in Kitchener." The reports reached the soldiers of the insult to Premier Borden when he visited Kitchener during his campaign, and the subsequent refusal of the City Council to make an apology. Deep indignation was expressed by the troops everywhere, and it is certain that the Unionist candidate in the riding in which Kitchener is included, gained several thousand votes from this circumstance alone.

SHIP BUILT IN 7 MONTHS

First Steel Vessel For the American Fleet is Launched.

Washington, Dec. 20.—A telegram to the Shipping Board told of the launching at Los Angeles of the first steel merchant ship contracted for by the Emergency Fleet Corporation. The vessel was one of eight of 3,800 tons capacity each ordered May 12th, from S. L. Naphthal.

Turning out the vessel within seven months when the yard in which it was built had to be constructed after the contract was let was hailed by Shipping Board officials as demonstrating what American industry can do in an emergency. One vessel contracted for by the

Fleet Corporation already has been launched, but it came from the yard at Seattle, which had been in operation for many years.

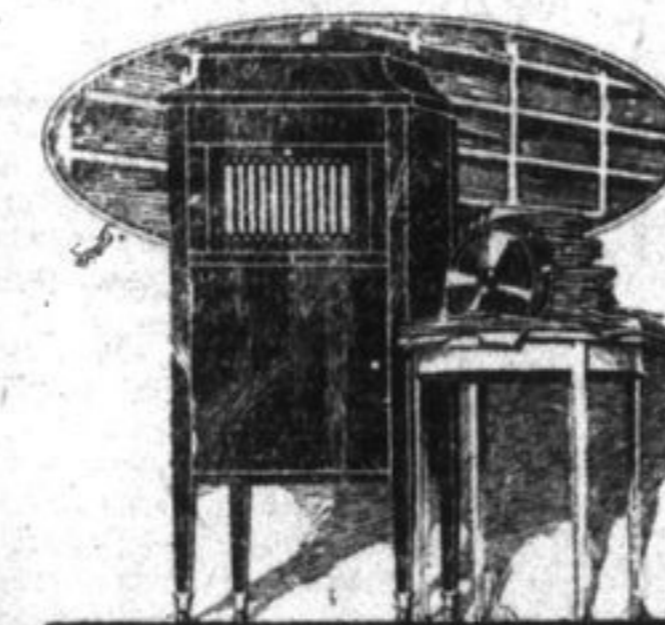

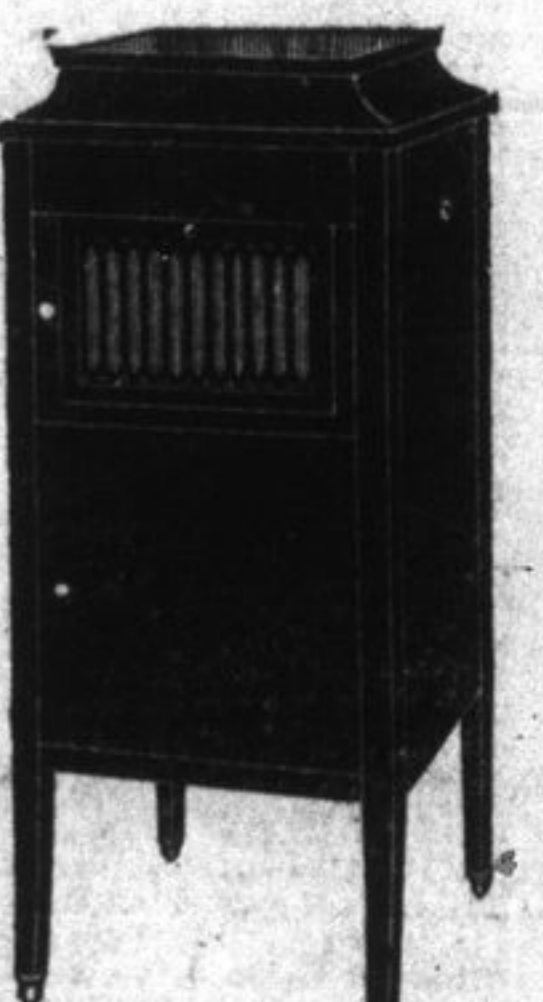
