

Youthful and effective is this costume of gray jersey trimmed with eatin in self-color and buttons.

A youthful design, featuring the dart-fitted waist is this dress of gray jersey. The shawl collar is of satin in self-color, the fronts being crossed and buttoned in double-breasted effact. The back of the waist is laid in plaits at the lower edge and lengthened by a straight band, gath ered at the sides to form a girdle Deep cuffs finish the one-plece sleeves. In medium size the costume requires 35% yards 54-inch mate

The underbody may be omitted. if desired, but if used is very simple to make. To properly start the outer waist, take up a dart in front at shoulder, bringing together and stitching along corresponding lines of small "o" perforations. Plait front. also lower edge of back placing "T" on corresponding small "o" perforations and tack. Gather band between "T" perforations, sew to lower edge of outer back as notched. Close under-arm and shoulder seams as notched. Large "O" perforations indicate



and finish edges below for closing. Close seam as notched. Face cuff sew to sleeve as notched, with smal "o" perforation at the seam of sleeve stitch upper edge of cuff to sleeve Sew sleeve in armhole as notched with small "o" perforation at shoulder seam easing in any fulness between notches. Hold the sleeve toward you when basting it in

Then slash the skirt to the left of center-front along double small "oo" perforations and finish edges for clos ing. Close dart seam as notched Close center-back seam. Form plaits (front and back) creasing on lines of slot perforations, bring the folded edges nearest center-front and center-back to centers and baste; bring remaining folded edges to corresponding lines of small "o" perforations, baste and press plaits. Gather skirt (at upper edge) between "T" perforations and adjust on underbody with upper edge of skirt at line of small "o" perforations in underbody front and back, center-fronts and center-backs even; bring dart seam to large "O" perforation in un-derbody front and bring large "O" perforation at top of skirt to underarm seam. Trim the suit with buttons of self-
