RUSSIAN IDEAS GET TO GERMAN SOLDIERS
 Hun Officers Cannot Stop the Spread of Bolsheviki Propaganda.

Toronto, Jan. 3.—A Mail and Empire cable from London says: "The fraternization of troops on the eastern front has already passed beyond the control of enemy officers," wires Petrograd correspondent of the Daily News.

"Quantities of revolutionary newspapers, printed in Germany," he adds, "are being distributed. An illustrated supplement contains, among other stimulating matter, a photograph of the German embassy here, with a huge banner across it, inscribed 'the proletariat of all lands unite.'"

"Underneath is written: 'these words are the words of a German. Did von Hindenburg utter them? No. They are the words of Karl Marx. We shall be sending a Russian workman to live in the Russian embassy in Berlin. When will you send a German workman as ambassador to Petrograd?'"

FORCE BELGIAN WOMEN TO DIG HUN TRENCHES
 Those Between 17 and 35 Sent to Front to Make Defences.

Washington, Jan. 3.—Instances in which Belgian women between the ages of 17 and 35 are being compelled by the German military authorities in Belgium to dig trenches are narrated in an official communication, which was received and made public to-day by the Belgian Legation. The despatch says that women between these ages have been compelled to dig trenches. Men are likewise being requisitioned for military work and sent to unknown destinations.
