CARRIED 300-POUND PATIENT DOWN LADDER

Gallant Work of Dr. Devlin, Graduate Queen's University at Fire.

Carrying a patient weighing 300 pounds down three storeys was the herculean feat performed by Dr. Devlin, a graduate of Queen's University, during the fire at the Ottawa General hospital, Water street. Dr. Devlin was assisting to remove the patient when he saw one patient in a room which was near the fire.

Thinking only of the danger the woman was in, Dr. Devlin lifted her from her bed and carried her to the ground floor. When seen by a reporter Dr. Devlin admitted having carried the patient, but added: "I do not know where I got the strength to carry her—perhaps it was the excitement."

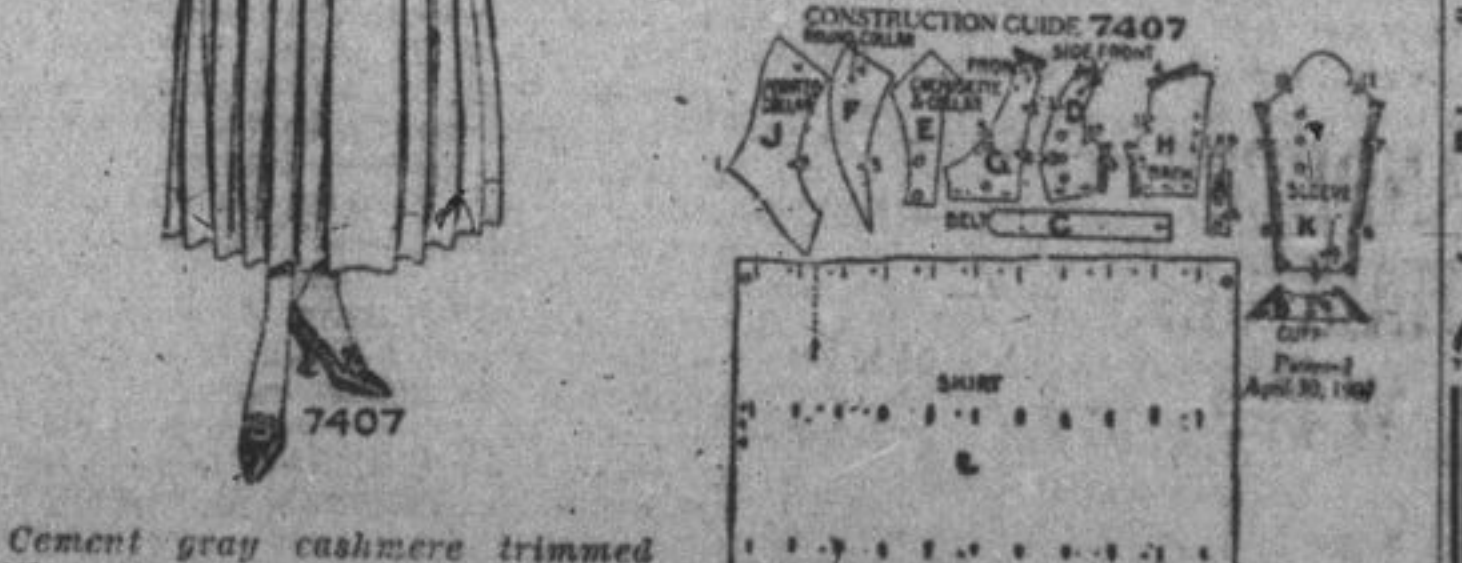

The Trend Toward Fitted Effects.

with notches and center-backs even. The small "o" perforations in the chemisette indicate the center-back. Close back seam, face and sew to neck edge, center-backs even and perpendicular front along small "o" perforations. Button in front and roll collar and chemisette as illustrated. To make the sleeve, sew lap underneath slashed edge as notched; turn over on outside on large "O" perforations and fell remaining edge over seam; stitch upper and free edges to position. Lap to small "o" perforations and finish for closing. Close seam of sleeve as notched. Face cuff and sew to lower edge of sleeve-notches even; bring small "o" perforation in cuff to seam of sleeve. Sew sleeve in armhole as notched, with small "o" perforation at shoulder.



Cement grey cashmere trimmed with satin is used to fashion this frock with high waist and plaited skirt. The chemisette is of cream organdy.

The tendency toward fitted effects is displayed in this high-waisted dress of cement grey cashmere. A shawl collar of black satin and chemisette of deep cream organdy enhance the elegance of the model. Flare cuffs finish the one-piece sleeves and the skirt is laid in plaits. In medium sizes the dress requires 5 yards 54-inch material, with 3/4 yard organdy for the chemisette and 1/2 yard 36-inch satin for the collar. In making the dress begin with the side front as notched. Then, close under-arm and shoulder seams, turn lower edge under on a neat perforation and baste. The large "O" perforations indicate the center-front. In order to keep the neck from stretching, next face the collar and sew to neck edge of back and front edge of front.
