SOLDIER FROM KINGSTON.

Was Found Dead in a Lane Off Montreal Street.

A Canadian Press despatch from Montreal says: Four bodies were taken to the morgue here, yesterday. Among them was Harry Bow-man, a soldier of Kingston, Out., who was found dead in a lane off Visitation street, near Sherbrooke streets and is thought to have died of hem-

Harry Bowman was a well-known Ringstonian. He was born in the city some twenty-five years ago. his mother residing on King street west. Ha was married and lived on St. Catherine street. On December 8th last he gave up his taxi work and enlisted, going, two days later, with the relief party which was sent to. Halifax. In this party was also Alexander Duncan. The details of the tragedy have not yet been received.
