ALLOWANCES INCREASED.

Important Changes Are Announced

by Patriotic Fund. mittee of the Canadian Patriotic

By the new regulations the maximum allowance for dependents in Eastern Canada has been raised to \$40 per month, instead of \$35 as formerly. This increase, which amounts to \$10 within the last two months, is due to the increased cost of living, and will materially assist those wives of soldiers who have

Another regulation provides that the different branches shall not deduct \$5 per month from the wives of non-commissioned officers, with the rank of sergeant or sergeant-major, as has been done in the past. This is due to a uniform scale of separation allowances having been adopted for privates and non-commissioned

It is also provided that there shall be no reduction in the allowance granted to returned soldiers who are "out patients" jat. convalescent homes, on account of the subsistence allowance having been raised from 60 to 80 cents a day.
