



A scientific marvel that is of inestimable value in war operations. This instrument, known as the lightning recorder, gives warning of storms more than 200 miles away.



General view of the — British Corps School where officers of the American Expeditionary Force in France are learning British methods in modern warfare. The school is behind the lines on the Western front.




