TO OUTLINE HIS POSITION

Toronto, Feb. 7.—Lindsay Crawford, editorial writer of the Toronto Globe, whose recent speech at Montreal, in which he said that the Military Service Act was a failure, that the Government was also a failure, and that the Liberals who supported the Government now see the error of their ways, created a small sensation, is not how a member of the Globe staff.

Calgary, Feb. 7.—The story of how Inspector Newcombe and Corporal Hutchings, of the Royal North West Mounted Police, stood off a mob of three hundred and fifty infuriated coal miners, mostly foreigners, at Drumheller, will go on records of the R.N.W.M.P. as one of the finest bits of police work in the history of the force.

THREE BURNED TO DEATH. When Riverview Hotel at Winnipeg Was Destroyed.

Winnipeg, Feb. 7.—In a fire which completely destroyed the Riverview hotel in the Elmwood suburb of Winnipeg early to-day, entailing a loss of \$175,000, Benson Moran, a waitress, was badly burned, and George Watreck, a barber, less seriously.

MISSING SOLDIER'S DISC. Finding of Identity Plaque Taken to Mean He is Dead.

Cornwall, Feb. 2.—An envelope containing a metal disc, with the figures 455339 R.C.R., was received by John Carriere in Cornwall today. It was picked up somewhere in France and is taken to establish the fact that his son, Private Phillippe Carriere, who has been missing since October 9, 1916, is dead.

Charleston Private Killed. Brockville, Feb. 7.—Mrs. Maggie Botstford, Charleston, was officially notified yesterday that Pte. Wilfrid Gerald Botstford, infantry, was killed in action on January 25th.

Death of Tweed Citizen. Tweed, Feb. 6.—W. G. Arber, baker, of this village, died Tuesday afternoon of pneumonia, aged thirty-four years.

\$5.50 For Eight Hours. Vancouver, Feb. 7.—The demands of the house carpenters in this city which were made some time ago, which became operative on February 5th have been accepted by the employers and now the men receive \$5 per eight hour day, with agreement that this wage will increase to \$5.50 from May 1.

1914 Star for Major Elliott. Cobourg, Feb. 7.—Major H. C. S. Elliott of Cobourg, formerly of Toronto, has recently been decorated with the 1914 star. Dr. Elliott is one of the original members of the staff of the 2nd Canadian Stationary Hospital at Le Touquet, the first Canadian hospital unit to reach France after war was declared.
