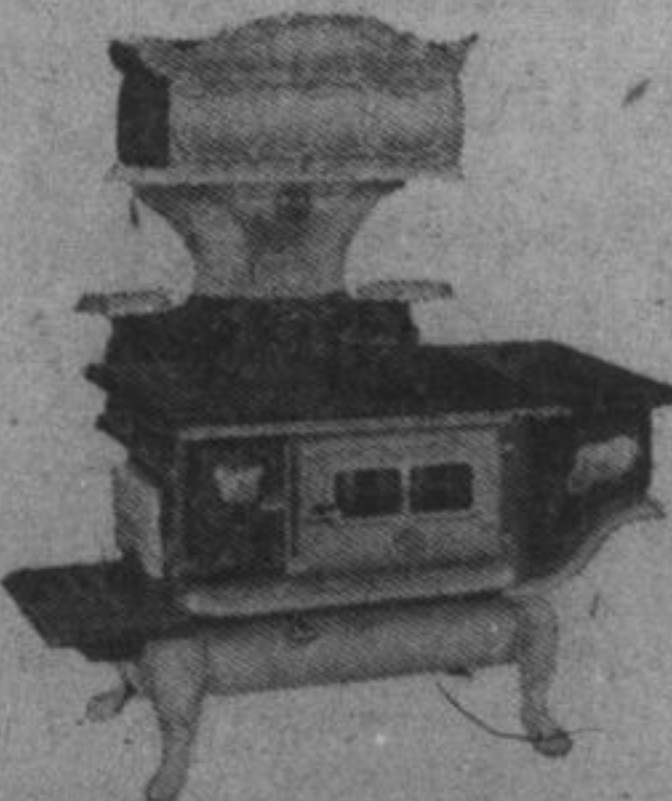

CAPT. F. F. CARR-HARRIS SHELL FORGERS VICTORS

KINGSTON OFFICER HAS PROVEN HIMSELF A HERO IN FRANCE

Graduated From The Royal Military College and Then Queen's Medical College—Was In Honan, China.

The Distinguished Service Order which has come to Captain F. F. Carr-Harris, son of Prof. and Mrs. R. Carr-Harris, Mackinac, is a decoration to one of the city's sons who has graduated as a soldier, a doctor and a missionary, and now in the war has showed himself a hero. Perhaps no other Kingstonian has been through so many experiences in so short a career and better fitted himself for such an honor.

Captain Carr-Harris graduated from the Royal Military College in 1897 and immediately started on a course as a doctor and there obtained the degrees of M.R.C.S. and L.R.C.P. Two years in London were followed by two years in New York hospitals. In the fall of 1913 he came to Kingston and was ordained in St. Andrew's church as a missionary of the Canadian Presbyterian church and left shortly afterwards for Honan, China, to take over the duties of a medical missionary.

When the war broke out, ill-health necessitated his journeying to London for special treatment. The war demanded his services even more than the mission fields and he did not return to China. Instead he took a commission in the Royal Army Medical Corps and was detailed for service with the 15th Highland Light Infantry. At the battle of Passchendaele Capt. Carr-Harris saved the lives of dozens of men by carrying them through mud and swamp, out of danger. For doing this and in consideration of his work generally at the front the King personally gave him the coveted order a few days ago.

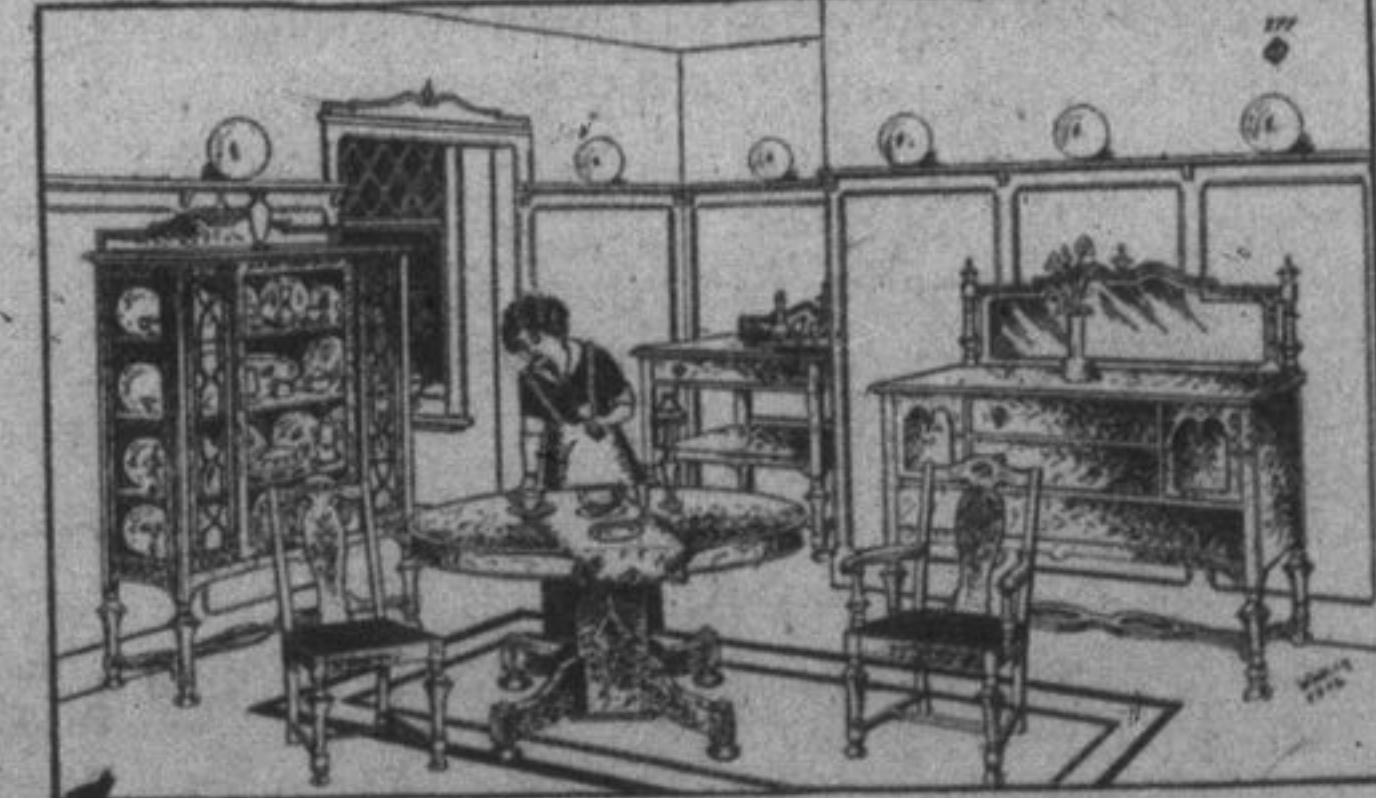
