



No. 1.—Latest type of motor kitchen, which is under consideration of adoption by the United States government. The kitchen's capacity of feeding is 2,600 men, almost an entire regiment. It is now being tested at Fort Myer, Va., and if it comes up to specifications the War Department will have several hundred of them constructed for service in France.

No. 2.—West African native troops of the Gold Coast, who are fighting in the German East African campaign side by side with the native East African troops. These troops can be compared with any of the native troops of the British Empire.

No. 3.—According to a Dublin report, Captain William Redmond, son of John Redmond, the Irish nationalist leader, has been awarded the D. S. O. for conspicuous bravery in battle. The act for which he was decorated occurred during the recent fighting in Flanders. He was commanding a company holding a position in a shell crater when he was blown out of the crater by an exploding shell. Despite his injuries he rallied his men and by promptly forming a defensive flank saved his part of the line.
