INSPECTOR OF CANADIAN FIRE UNDERWRITERS TO COME HERE

Advocates Electrical Conduit Work As Safer For the Property Owner -Smaller Insurance Premiums Would Result.

Kingston property owners can now prepare for an inspection of all electric appliances in the city. The Cananadian Fire Underwriters will in the near future send an expert inspector here who will go over the varthe requirements of the wiring under the increased pressure of hydro

It is stated that the old-fashioned wiring which was made for 110 volts direct current is entirely inadequate for 110 volts alternating current with hydro power, which is liable to heavily increased loads.

The inspector will advocate contrical installation, as this will reduce the fire risk so much that smaller premiums may be given and the ost of the work thus made to pay

In speaking of the inspectionwhich will certainly be very important to every person with electrical co-operation between the inspector and the public was very desirable for each, as his suggestions would be worthy of very careful consideration in view of the insight that he has into the fire risk question.

Get Out Your Sap Buckets. Farmers and others who have maple sugar outlits, even if they have not been in use for years, should put them to work this year. There is sugar shortage, and Canadian maple trees should be made to produce to the maximum. So even if you have not the most up-to-date equipment. tap all the trees you can and make the most of the facilities you have on hand. There'll be a good market for all the maple sugar and syrup pro-
