CIVIC BUDGET FOR 1918

TO BE PRESENTED TO THE CITY COUNCIL TO-NIGHT.

The Tax Rate is 29 1/2 Mills—Hospitals Receive \$20,000—Details of the Budget.

The budget which will be presented to the City Council to-night is as follows:

The committee on finance and accounts, in submitting the estimates for the year 1918, beg leave to report as follows:

The bonded debt of the city to 31st December, 1917, is \$1,733,812.33, made up as follows:

The amount of sinking funds is \$225,494.39, and of this amount \$191,433.13 is invested in Government and municipal debentures and \$34,061.26 is on special deposit in the Bank of British North America.

The amount to be levied for the sinking funds this year is \$41,721.53, the parties specially benefited paying \$19,147.83 and the city generally paying \$22,573.70.

Increased appropriations have to be provided for the hospitals and for the Board of Education this year, but owing to the fact that there was a surplus of \$1,977.50 carried forward from the year 1917 as compared with a deficiency of \$12,130.70 from the preceding year and also in consequence of a slight increase in the anticipated ordinary revenue, your committee have been able to maintain the present rate of taxation while allowing the various spending committees amounts equal to and in some cases greater than those of last year.

Your committee recommend that a rate of 18 1/2 mills for general purposes and 9.07 mills for educational purposes, making in all 27 1/2 mills on the dollar, be placed on this year's ordinary assessment, and also that a rate of 1 mill on the dollar for the collection and disposal of garbage be imposed on the assessment liable therefor.
