

RETURNED MEN'S RECORDS

ISSUED BY THE SPECIAL SERVICE HEADQUARTERS.

The Public Are Given Some Interesting Information With Regard to Men Who Receive Their Discharge.

455935, Private G. E. Hicks, enlisted on March 10th, 1916, in the 59th Battalion in Gananogue. He accompanied the unit overseas, going to Caesar's Camp, Folkestone, where he transferred to the Royal Canadian Regiment, and left for France in a draft. He returned to Canada on 18th October, 1917, after being eighteen months overseas.

1093336, Private N. J. Deline, enlisted on February 12th, 1917, in the 254th Battalion in Madoc. He went overseas with the unit to Seaford, enlisted in the 155th Battalion at being attached to the 5th Reserve, Bellefleur on February 1st, 1918. Here he contracted pleurisy, and on trained at Barriefield before going overseas in the E. O. overseas the following October. In his recovery was sent to the E. O. overseas in England he was stationed at Witley R. D. He returned to Canada on the 8th January last. His home is in Bannockburn.

220173, Corporal E. H. Friend, enlisted in October, 1915, in the 30th Battalion at Belleville. He trained at Barriefield until the end of that season, and accompanied the unit overseas the following May. In England he was stationed at Borden Camp, and later at Bramshott. He transferred to the 75th Battalion and went to France in the 4th division in August, 1918. He was in action on the Somme and Vimy, where he got shell shock. He went to the 20th General Hospital, Combers and later to England on convalescent. He was eight months in France. Returned to Canada last August. His home is in Trenton.

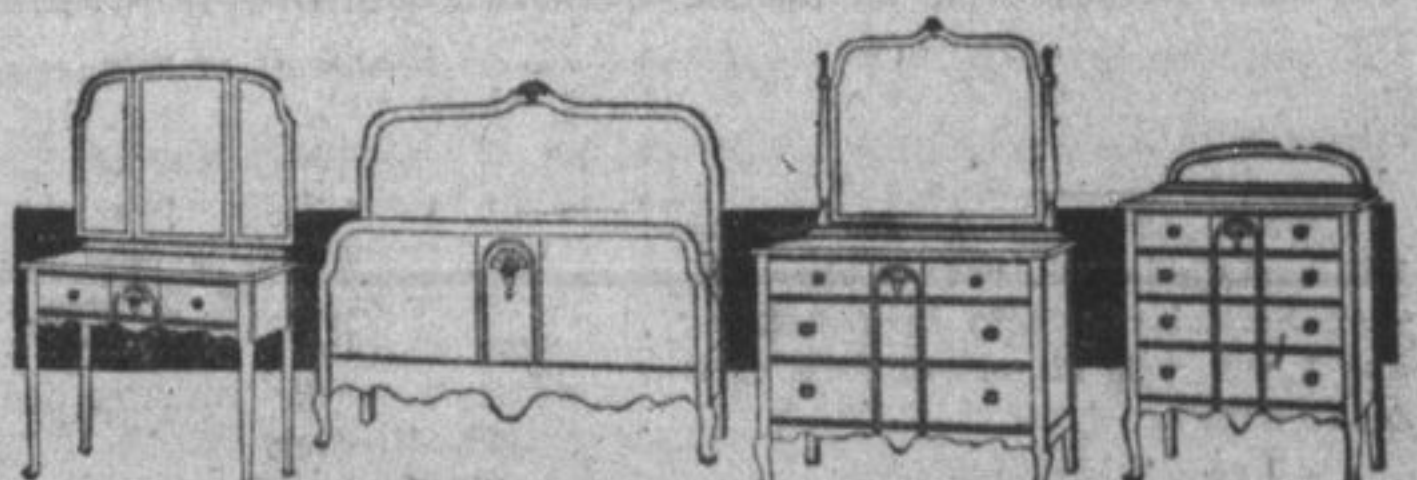
