What Will Happen if Japan Intervenes in Russia

Delicate and momentous questions of Allied diplomacy charged with the gravest military pessibilities are raised by the proposal that Japanese troops intervene in Siberia to save from Germany's clutches the great military stores accumulated at Vladivostok and along the Trans-Siberian railroad. and to forestall the German penetration of Asia.

Such intervention, of course, might produce friction, if not hostilities between Japan and Russia, and Germany is quick to see the advantage, for it would soon lead, in the opinion of the Cologne Volkzeitung, either to a Russo-German agreement against Japan or to an undertaking between Japan and Germany. On the other hand, the Boston Transcript suggests that 'perhaps Japan's sword will avail where America's pen has falled either to help Russia or hinder Germany's operations
