**TWO BATTERIES WERE LOST**

MESSAGE WAS INTENSELY INTERESTING TO OFFICERS.

The R.C.H.A. is reported as having driven the Germans back—Practically "Kingston's Own."

"Two Canadian batteries lost" was the principal topic of conversation in military circles here on Thursday. That bald statement from overseas contained more tragic news to the soldiers, particularly those of the permanent force, that has any item in the war news since the big drive of the Huns started. It has brought the war close to Kingston because of the intimacy of all Canadian artillery with this city.

Tete de Pont Barracks was for six weeks or eight weeks the home of every officer now overseas with the Canadian artillery. The only artillery training school, outside of one for garrison artillery at Quebec, was held in Kingston, and through this Royal School of Artillery the officers of the two lost Canadian batteries must have passed before receiving their commission.

The local officers are waiting anxiously for further word so that the names of the officers and men of the two batteries could be learned.

The message that the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery Brigade was helping to drive back the enemy brought a "reminder of the South African war, when such messages were often received. This brigade may well be called "Kingston's Own," and its career overseas has been watched closely. Lieut.-Col. W. H. P. Atkins is now commanding the brigade.

Through the kindness of Lieut.-Col. (now General) H. A. Panet, the Whig in April, 1915, received a nominal roll of the brigade, then overseas. In it there are many familiar names. There have been—fortunately—few casualties so far, and many of the original men must be in action. The nominal roll shows the following officers with Kingston as their address: H. A. Panet, H. E. Bos\*, W. H. P. Atkins, F. M. Benson, H. W. MacPherson, W. G. Haggarty, H. P. Lafferty.
