PRACTICAL PATRIOTISM
LENOX AND ADDINGTON COUNCIL TO PURCHASE SEED.
Which Will be Resold to the Resident Farmers—Capt. K. M. Shorey Married in England—Personal News.
(From Our Own Correspondent's Napanee, March 27.)—The County Council of Lennox and Addington met here today in response to the request of the lieutenant-governor to consider ways and means to assist in the maximum production of essential food stuffs in the county this year, and after passing many important measures regarding the same, the council took an entirely new step, as a county council, by passing a by-law providing for the purchase by the county, through the accredited agent of the organization of resources committee, the district representative of the Agricultural Department, of car loads of seed grain, wheat, oats, and corn to be sold to resident farmers, marquis wheat at \$2 a bushel and O.A.C. No. 72, oats, and corn, the latter two grains at cost price, said seed grains to be sown this season by farmers. It is expected this action by the council will materially increase the production in the county, of wheat at least, and will certainly improve the quality of its oats where such seed is used, and as to the corn, it will fill the wants of the farmers. Let such practical steps be followed by other counties and an increase of production of wheat and other cereals will certainly follow. All honor to the old U.E.L. county for its measure of practical patriotism.
